

Major acquisition sets Minerals 260 up for an exciting 2025

QUARTERLY ACTIVITY HIGHLIGHTS

CORPORATE

- Subsequent to quarter-end, the Company executed binding documentation to acquire 100% of the Bullabulling Gold Project from Norton Gold Fields Pty Ltd, a wholly owned subsidiary of Zijin Mining Group Co., Ltd.
- With a JORC 2012 RPEEE¹ Mineral Resource Estimate (MRE) of 60Mt @ 1.2g/t Au for 2.3Moz², Bullabulling is one of Australia's largest open-pittable and near-term production gold resources.
- Cash consideration of A\$156.5m plus A\$10.0m of Minerals 260 shares represents an acquisition cost of A\$74/oz for 2.3Moz, exceptional value for an asset of this scale, location and quality.
- During the quarter, Tim Goyder was appointed Chairman, Stacey Apostolou joined as a Non-Executive Director and Jamie Armes commenced as Chief Financial Officer and Company Secretary on 1 January 2025.
- At quarter-end, the Company had a cash balance of \$9.2m.

MOORA, ASTON & DINGO ROCKS PROJECTS

- Infill auger drilling and ground Fixed-Loop Electromagnetic (FLEM) geophysical surveys completed over targets on the Mount Yule Magnetic Anomaly (MYMA) at the Moora Project.
- Infill auger assay results are pending, with results expected in late-January to early-February.
- Two new tenements were granted at the Aston Project, increasing the Project area to 1,750km².
- No field work was undertaken at the Aston and Dingo Rocks Projects during the quarter.
- Strategic review of all exploration projects to be undertaken given the focus on Bullabulling going forward.

Bullabulling Gold Project, WA (Minerals 260: 0% - Acquiring)

Project Background

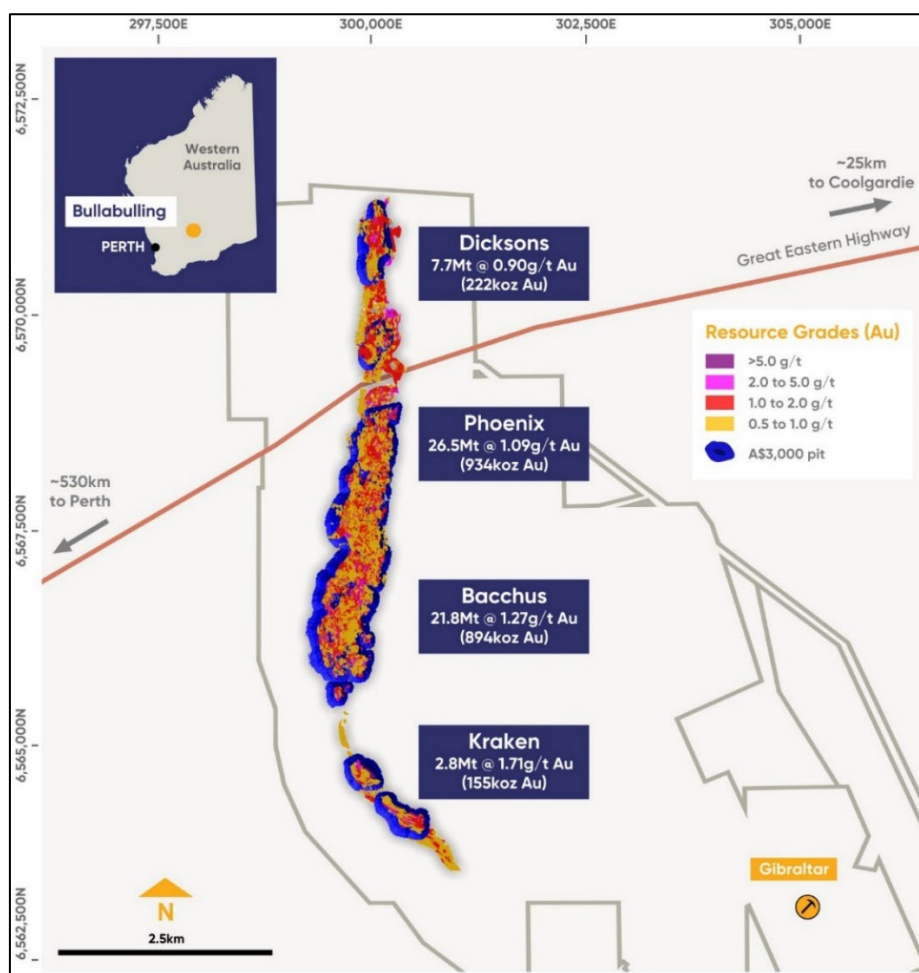


Figure 2 Bullabulling Project Plan View

Bullabulling presents a major near-term gold development opportunity located 25km south-west of Coolgardie in the Eastern Goldfields region of Western Australia. The Project hosts a JORC 2012 RPEEE MRE of 60Mt @ 1.2g/t Au for 2.3Moz of gold (Indicated and Inferred, refer to **Table 1** below), on granted mining leases (M15/503, M15/1414, M15/282, M15/554 and M15/552) and is located within a largely contiguous 127km² tenement package (**Figure 2**).

Acquisition Information

The Proposed Transaction delivers Minerals 260 an immediate Mineral Resource of scale in a highly prospective gold region, providing a strong platform for Minerals 260 to advance towards gold production and establish a significant long-life mining business, with key attributes including:

- A MRE reported in December 2024 comprising **60Mt @ 1.2g/t Au for 2.3Moz of gold** (JORC 2012) with ~60% of the Mineral Resource in the Indicated Resource category (**Table 1**).

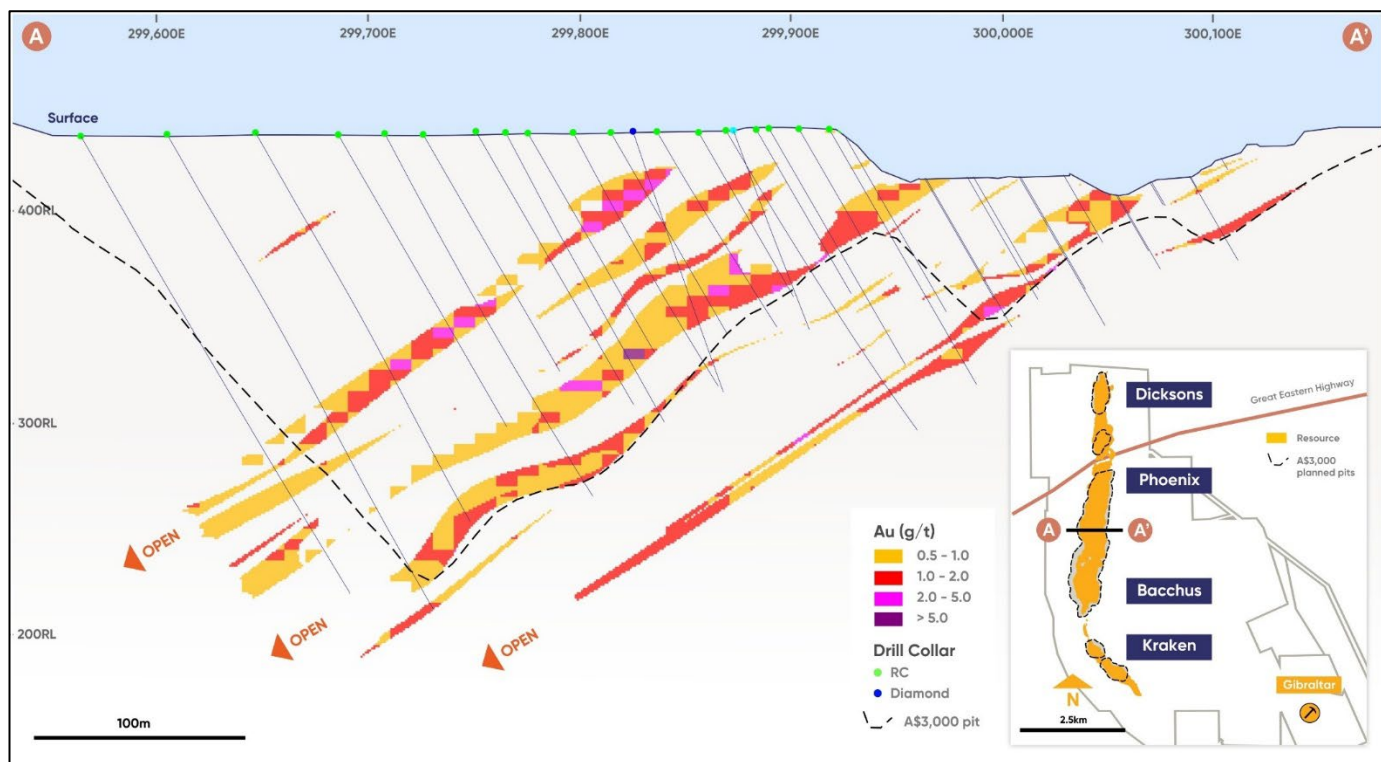


Figure 3 Bullabulling plan view and cross section showing gold grades, drilling intercepts and A\$3,000 pit shells

- Minerals 260 plans to **commence an 80,000 metres Reverse Circulation (“RC”) and Diamond Core (“DD”) infill and resource extension drilling campaign** targeting numerous highly prospective targets at depth and along strike immediately after completion of the Proposed Transaction, and is working with Norton Gold Fields to lodge the permits required (**Figure 3**).

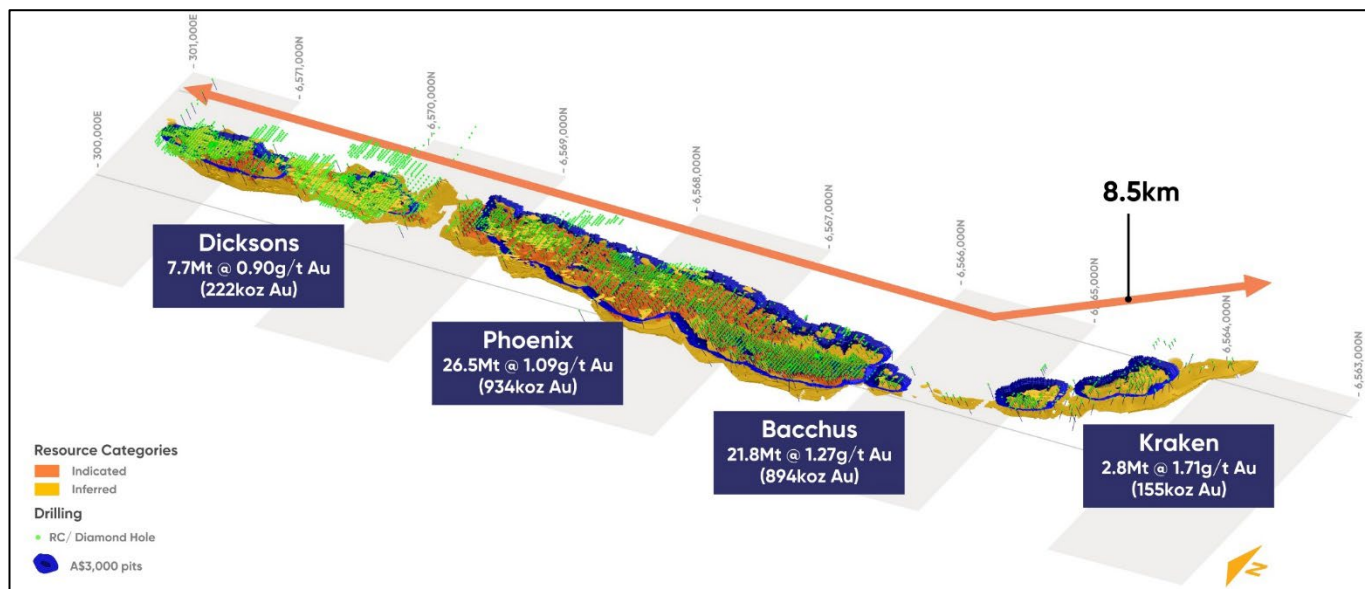


Figure 4 Bullabulling resource showing resource classifications and historic drilling – tilted and looking NE

- Extensive historical drilling, with **over 530,000 metres from approximately 12,000 drill holes**, drilled at an average depth of approximately 50 metres (**Figure 4**).

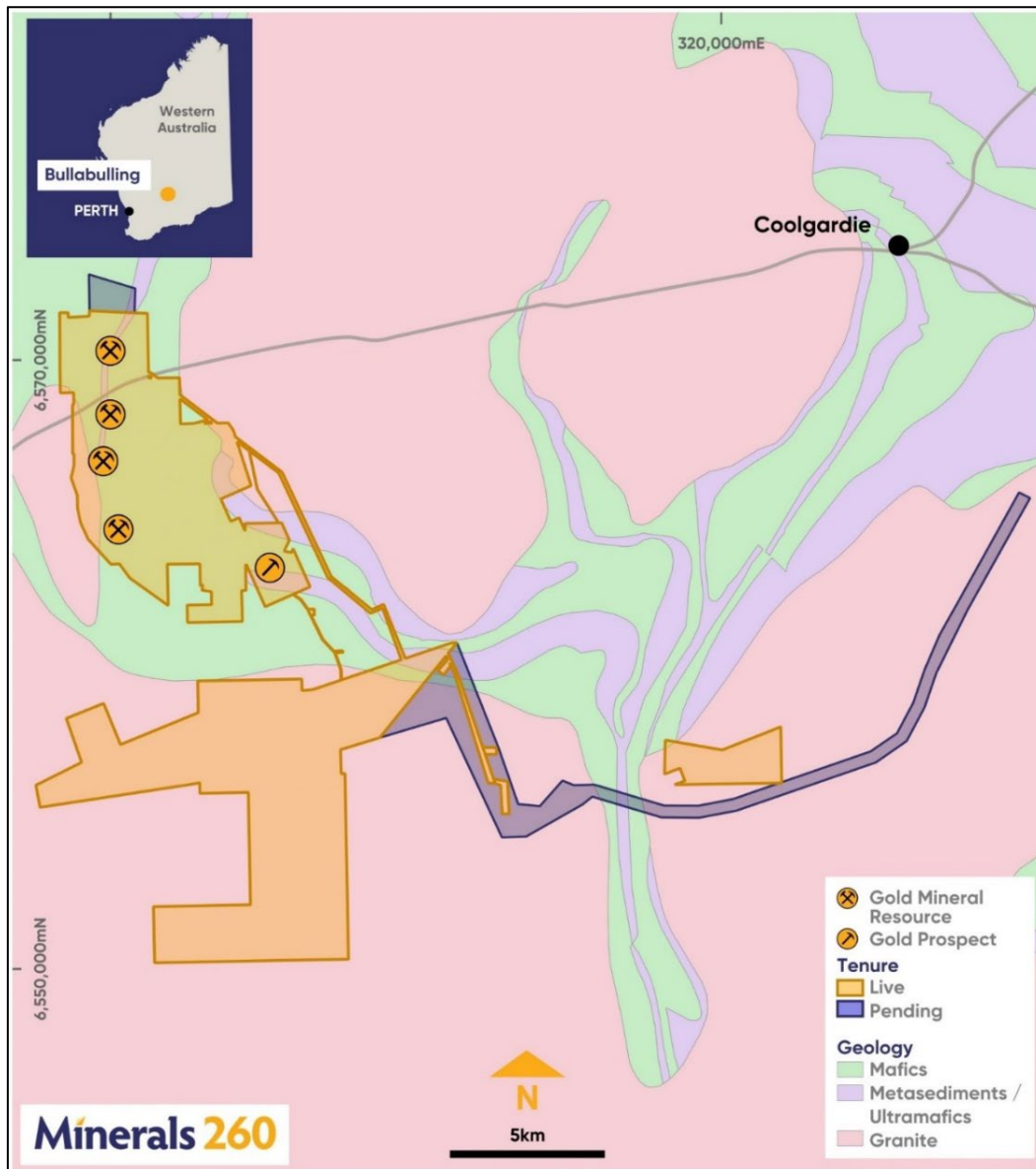


Figure 5 Bullabulling regional geology map and project tenements

- **The MRE is on granted mining leases** and located in the world-class mining location of Western Australia in the infrastructure-rich Coolgardie/Goldfields Region (**Figure 5**). A **Native Title Land Use Agreement** is also in place.
- **Significant previously completed metallurgical testing** supports recoveries of 87% across the Project and meaningful historical production in the 1990s of ~3.9Mt of ore recovering ~179,000 oz of gold when the gold price was ~A\$500 per ounce³.
- **Existing on-site infrastructure** includes an exploration camp, administration office, water services to camp, refueling tank, and storage buildings.

Conditions Precedent

Completion of the Proposed Transaction is subject to:

- Minerals 260 receiving Ministerial consent for the upstream change in ownership of a pastoral lease overlapping the Project ("Norton Pastoral Lease") as a result of the Company proposing to acquire Bullabulling Operations Pty Ltd;
- The parties agreeing a side deed to effect the transfer of the Norton Pastoral Lease subject to obtaining the necessary approvals (including, potentially post completion);
- Shareholder approval for the Proposed Transaction and the issue of the Consideration Shares to be considered at a general meeting of Minerals 260 shareholders;
- Completion of an equity raise of sufficient scale to fund the cash component of the Proposed Transaction;
- Minerals 260 receiving a conditional admission letter from ASX in anticipation of it re-complying with Chapters 1 and 2 of the Listing Rules for its re-admission to ASX; and
- Additional regulatory approvals and other standard conditions for a transaction of this nature.

The equity raising will incorporate a priority offer to existing shareholders located in Australia and New Zealand. Bell Potter Securities Limited and Argonaut Securities Pty Limited have been appointed Joint Lead Managers, and the Company will provide further details of the equity raise in due course. Greenhill & Co. has been appointed financial advisor and Allens as legal advisor. The Company expects to provide further details regarding the equity raise and the general meeting of shareholders in the coming weeks.

Moora Copper-Gold-PGE Project, WA (Minerals 260: 100%)

Project Background

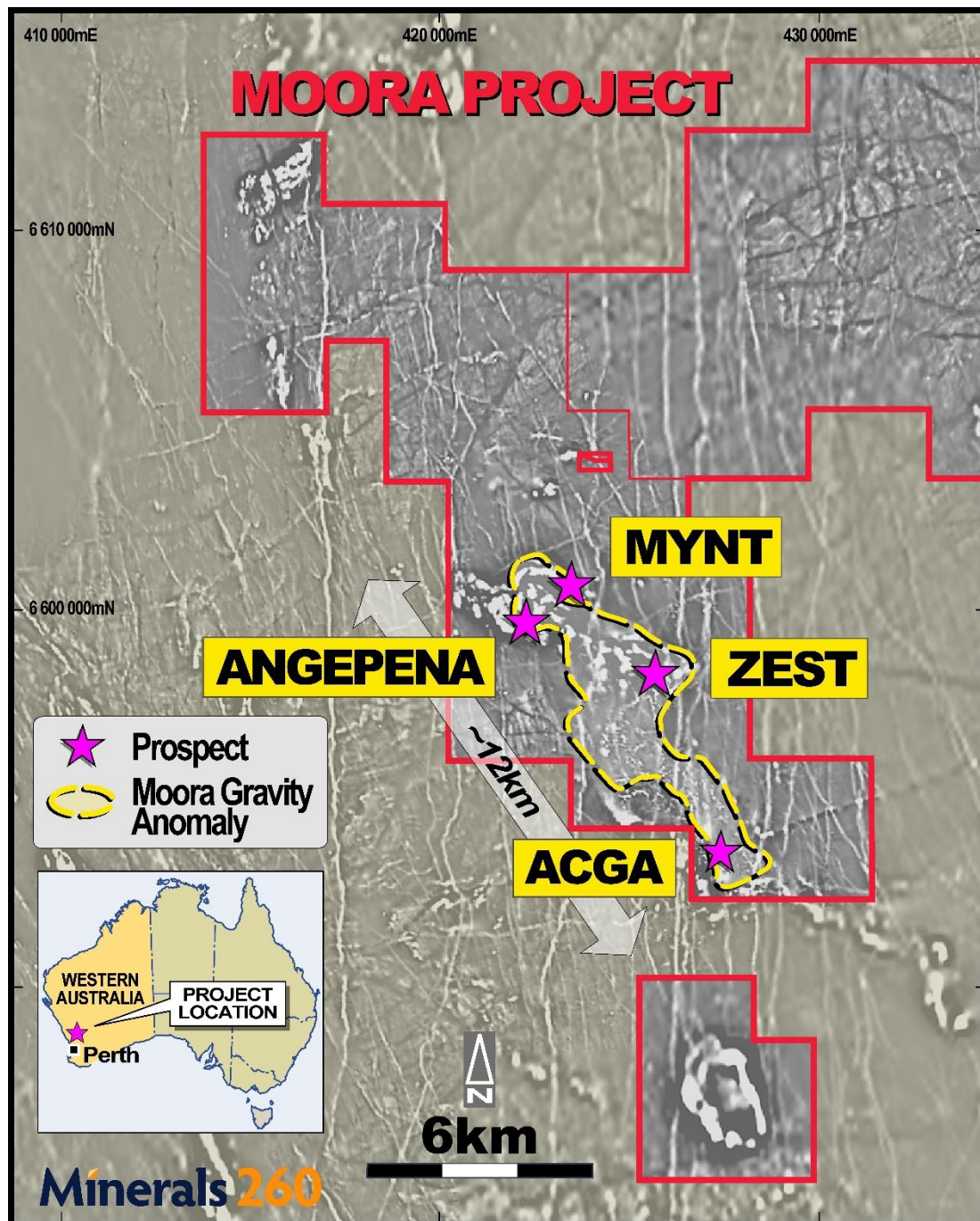


Figure 6 Moora Project - Aeromagnetic image showing advanced prospects.

The 100%-owned Moora Project is located ~150km north-east of Perth in the Julimar Mineral Province of SW Western Australia (**Figure 6**). The area is considered highly prospective for base and precious metals, with previous drilling by Minerals 260 intersecting multiple zones of bedrock mineralisation.

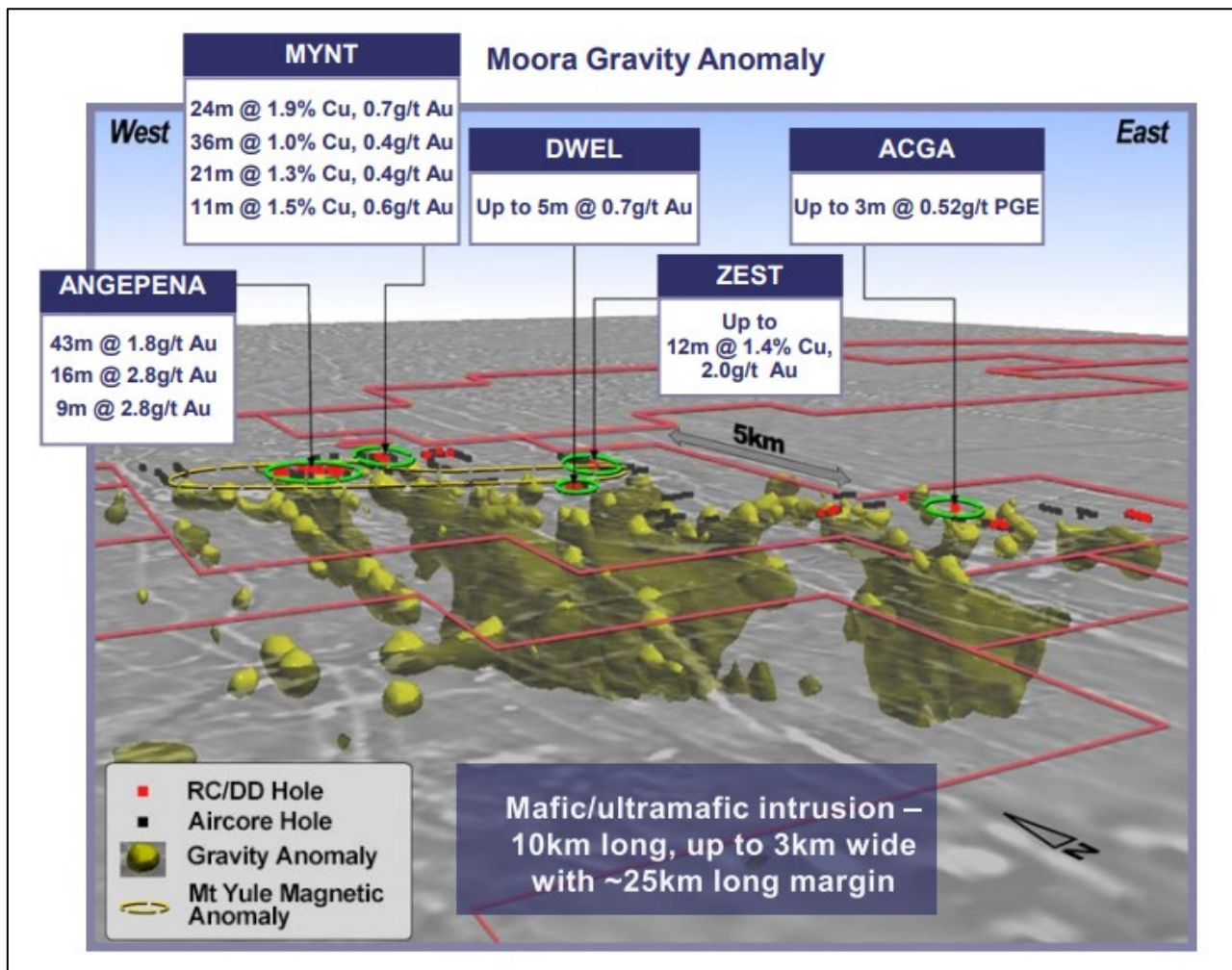


Figure 7 Moora Gravity Anomaly: Key Exploration Results and Targets.

Minerals 260 has been exploring at the Moora Project for approximately three years and has drilled 448 holes for ~36,000m (311 AC, 113 RC, 13 DD and 11 RC / DD), discovering several new prospects (**Figure 7**). Some of the more significant intersections reported have included:

- Mynt – up to **24m @ 1.9% copper and 0.7 g/t gold**, and **36m @ 1.0% copper and 0.4g/t gold**.
- Angepena – up to **43m @ 1.8g/t gold**, and **16m @ 2.8 g/t gold**.
- Dwel – up to **2.7g/t gold, 0.5% copper, 0.08% cobalt and 5.7% zinc**.
- Acga – up to **0.6 g/t palladium and 0.6% copper**.

Quarterly Activities

- During the quarter, infill auger drilling and ground Fixed-Loop Electromagnetic (FLEM) geophysical surveys were completed over targets on the Mount Yule Magnetic Anomaly (MYMA). The programs were designed to identify potential repeats of the high-grade copper-gold mineralisation found at Mynt, while also testing other base and precious metal prospects.
- Assay results from the auger drilling are pending and expected in late-January – early February. Results will be used to plan follow-up Air-Core and/or Reverse Circulation drilling.
- FLEM results indicated that targets defined by a previous wide-spaced ground EM survey were likely related to overburden and no follow-up work is planned

Aston Lithium, Uranium & Rare Earth Element Project, WA (Minerals 260: 100%)

Project Background

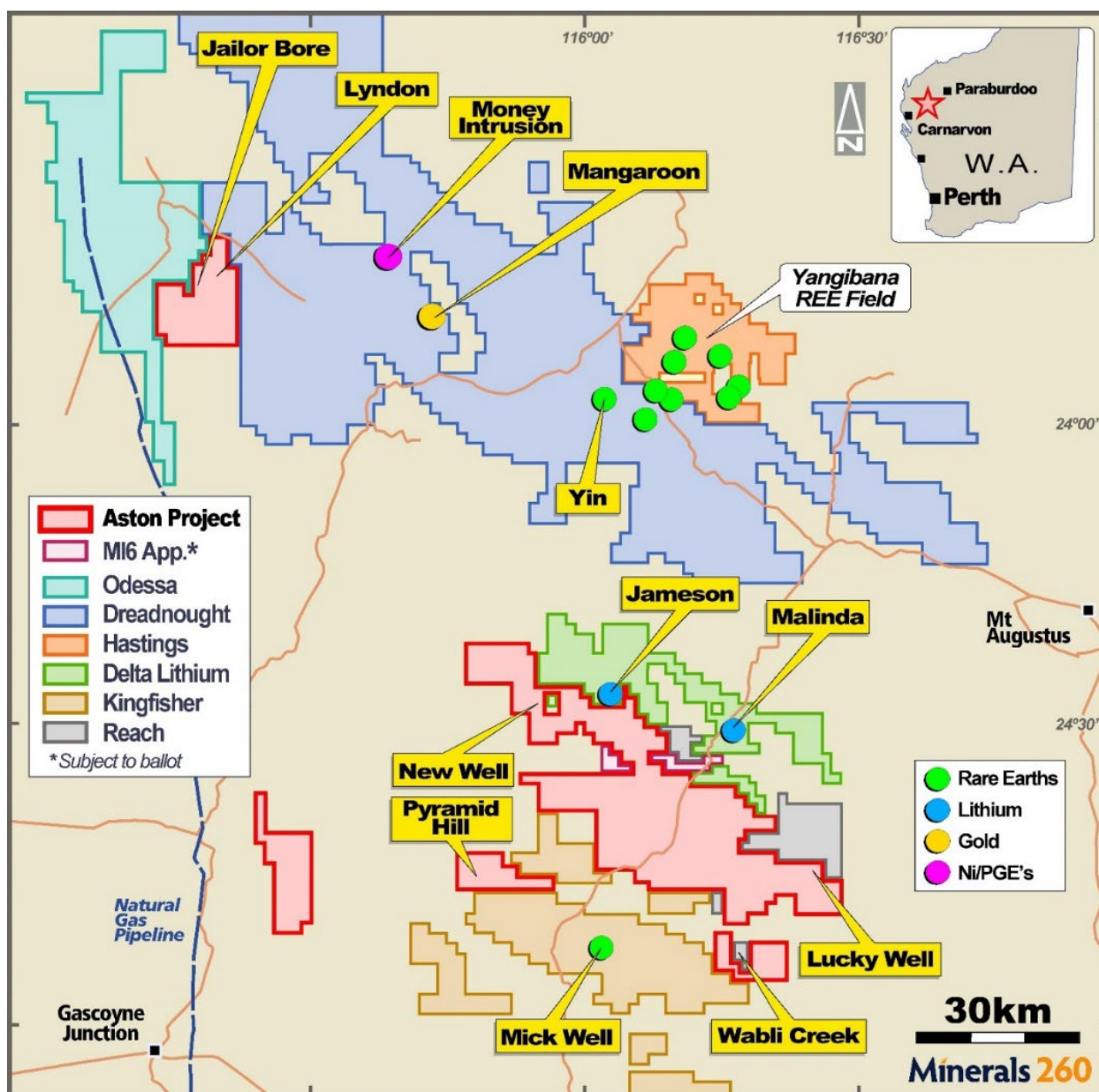


Figure 8 - Gascoyne Province - Location and tenement plan showing significant lithium and REE occurrences.

The Aston Project, comprising 16 largely contiguous tenements covering an area of 1,750km², is located approximately 230km east of Carnarvon and 850km north of Perth in the Gascoyne Province of Western Australia (**Figure 8**). The Gascoyne Province has been explored historically for gold, base metals, tungsten, and uranium; however, exploration by neighbouring tenement holders has highlighted the region's prospectivity for hard rock hosted lithium (spodumene), Rare Earth Elements (REE), niobium and uranium.

Nearby projects include Delta Lithium's Malinda lithium deposit and Jameson prospect (see DLI ASX announcements dated 20 January 2023, 3 April 2023, 27 December 2023 and 22 April 2024) and Dreadnought Resources' REE project and recent niobium drilling intercepts (see DRE ASX announcements dated 28 August 2023 and 9 October 2024). Odessa Minerals also confirmed the presence of calcrete-type uranium and vanadium mineralisation across multiple prospects at their Lyndon Project (see ODE ASX announcement dated 22 April 2024) and Reach Resources announced high-grade niobium rock chip results at their nearby Wabli Creek Project (see RR1 ASX announcement dated 12 June 2024).

Soil sampling by the Company has defined three other strong lithium (>100ppm Li₂O), tantalum and rubidium anomalies, including a 5km long, continuous trend at Pyramid Hill.

Exploration conducted by Minerals 260 in June 2024 (see ASX release dated 14 June 2024) confirmed uranium mineralisation at the Jailor Bore Extension Prospect, where multiple highly anomalous uranium (up to 1,095ppm U₃O₈) and vanadium (up to 518ppm V₂O₅) rock chips were recorded.

During the quarter, tenements E09/2967 and E09/2968 were granted, adding an additional ~40km² of prospective ground to the project.

Minerals 260 continues to progress desktop studies to determine the best way to advance the Aston Project, taking into consideration current market conditions and investor sentiment towards lithium exploration.

Dingo Rocks Base and Precious Metals Project, WA (Minerals 260: 100%)

Project Background

Following a comprehensive project review, the Company plans to surrender this tenement in Q1 2025.

Corporate

Cash, Expenditure and Payments to Related Parties of the Entity

As at 31 December 2024, the Company's cash balance was \$9.2m.

Cash expenditure in key segments for the quarter are as follows:

- Exploration and evaluation costs of ~\$0.2m (previous quarter ~\$0.3m);
- Corporate, administration, business development and employee costs of ~\$0.5m (previous quarter ~\$1.0m).

Payments reported in Appendix 5B (Section 6.1 and 6.2) to related parties of the entity and their associates totalled \$0.16m which consisted of Directors' fees, salaries (including superannuation and other on costs). All related party transactions have been agreed on an arms' length basis.

Board and Executive Changes

On 5 December 2024, the Company announced that Mr Tim Goyder had assumed the role of Non-Executive Chair, following the retirement of Mr Anthony Cipriano and that Ms Stacey Apostolou was appointed as a Non-Executive Director.

Ms Apostolou is a finance executive with over 30 years' experience working at senior levels in the Australian resources sector. She is currently the General Manager - Corporate at DevEx Resources Limited and a non-executive Director of Lachlan Star Limited. Ms Apostolou holds a Bachelor of Business degree and is a member of CPA Australia.

In addition, Mr Curtis Abbott, resigned as Chief Financial Officer and Company Secretary with effect on 31 December 2024. Mr Abbott has been succeeded by Mr Jamie Armes. Mr Armes is a Chartered Accountant and brings over 20 years of financial and company secretarial experience having held roles in various ASX-listed and global mining companies.

Share Capital

On 22 November 2024, the Company issued 5.75 million options to directors following the receipt of shareholder approval at the 2024 Annual General Meeting. The options are exercisable at \$0.195 each and have an expiry date of 21 November 2027. The director options vest immediately, with exception of the 2.5 million options issued to the nominee of Managing Director, Mr Luke McFadyen, where 50% of the options will vest on 24 September 2025 and the remaining 50% will vest on 24 September 2026.

During the quarter, the following options were forfeited on cessation of employment in accordance with the terms of the Company's Employee Securities Incentive Plan:

- 500,000 options exercisable at \$0.75 each, expiry 3 March 2025
- 1 million options exercisable at \$0.47 each, expiry 23 November 2026
- 1.5 million options exercisable at \$0.70 each, expiry 23 November 2026
- 1 million options exercisable at \$0.195 each, expiry 21 November 2027
- 1 million options exercisable at \$0.195 each, expiry 24 September 2027

On the appointment of Ms Apostolou, it was agreed, that subject to shareholder approval and in accordance with the Company's Employee Securities Incentive Plan, Ms Apostolou will be issued 750,000 options exercisable at \$0.19 each and expiring 3 years from the date of issue.

As part of his agreement to join the Company, on 1 January 2025, Mr Armes was granted 500,000 options exercisable at \$0.19 each and expiring 3 years from his commencement date, in accordance with the Company's Employee Securities Incentive Plan.
