QUARTERLY REPORT 30 SEPTEMBER 2023

Dragon Mountain Gold Limited (“DMG” or “the Company”) is pleased to provide this Quarterly Activity Report for the quarter ending 30 September 2023.

Exploration Activities

The Company has continued its exploration of the Avalon and Cawse Projects, utilising the latest exploration techniques and mineralisation models, whilst taking advantage of substantial historic datasets.

The Company continued working with Galt Mining Solutions on the proposed drill programs to further explore for gold over identified prospective targets and to allow the assessment of whether clay horizons contain higher Li/REE concentrations.

Current planning is for RC drill holes (targeting shear-hosted gold and REE/Li clays) of ~1,680 m as part of a Phase 1 program to provide adequate coverage over identified areas of interest to assess if further phases of drilling (and expenditure) are warranted for these commodities at the Avalon Project.

Prioritising of drill holes for the Phase 1 drill program is still under review with an allocation of more metres of the design to the southern tenements to assess for buried hard rock sources of Lithium (intrusions/dykes) as the preliminary surface assay data suggests an increase in Li-related element concentrations in felsic rocks (Sn-W-Ta-Hf) in this area, which was an inferred conclusion from the desktop study that younger, fractionated granitic intrusions exist to the south of DMG’s tenements.

Phase 2 drilling is at a preliminary stage to support any favourable results from Phase 1 to maintain momentum in testing continuity of both mineralisation and grades to assess the dimension of any higher grading intervals identified in the Phase 1 drilling. Phase 2 is also to progress the geological context of mineralised intervals to begin modelling and progressing the understanding of the project geology outside of the nickel-bearing laterites that cover the project.

In addition, the Company further assessed the exploration potential of its tenements acquired under the acquisition of Sleeklines Holdings Pty Ltd.

During the quarter the Company was made aware that its Joint Venture partner, Wingstar Investments Pty Ltd (Wingstar) received a recommendation from Kalgoorlie Mining Warden that tenements M24/517, M24/519, M24/543, M25/75, M25/76, M25/77, M25/78, and M27/189 be forfeited due to a shortfall in the required expenditure.

Wingstar have advised the Company that it disputes this recommendation and will lodge the appropriate appeals. At present, the Company maintains its 25% interest over the tenements and Wingstar remains the registered holder of the tenements.

Corporate Activity

At the end of the quarter, the Company's cash position was \$593,000.

ASX Additional Information

Pursuant to ASX Listing Rules 5.3.1 and 5.3.2, the Company advises it has spent \$29,000 on exploration during the quarter. No expenditure was incurred on development or production activities during the quarter.

Pursuant to ASX Listing Rule 5.3.5, the Company advises it has made payments of \$37,100 to directors by way of salary, fees, or superannuation during the quarter.
