Global Nuclear Demand Growth:

The World Nuclear Association predicts global nuclear capacity could reach 1446 GWe by 2050, surpassing the approximately 1200 GWe target established under the “Declaration to Triple Nuclear Energy” (COP28)¹, driven by new reactor construction and life extensions globally



Structural Supply Bottlenecks:

Includes ongoing issues at Kazatomprom² responsible for 40% of global supply; and full US import ban³ on Russian uranium imports from 2028



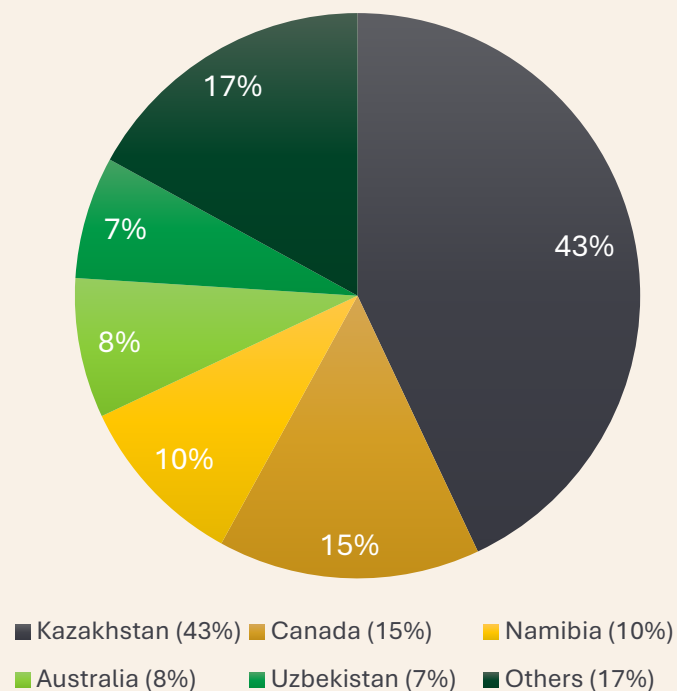
Pricing Support:

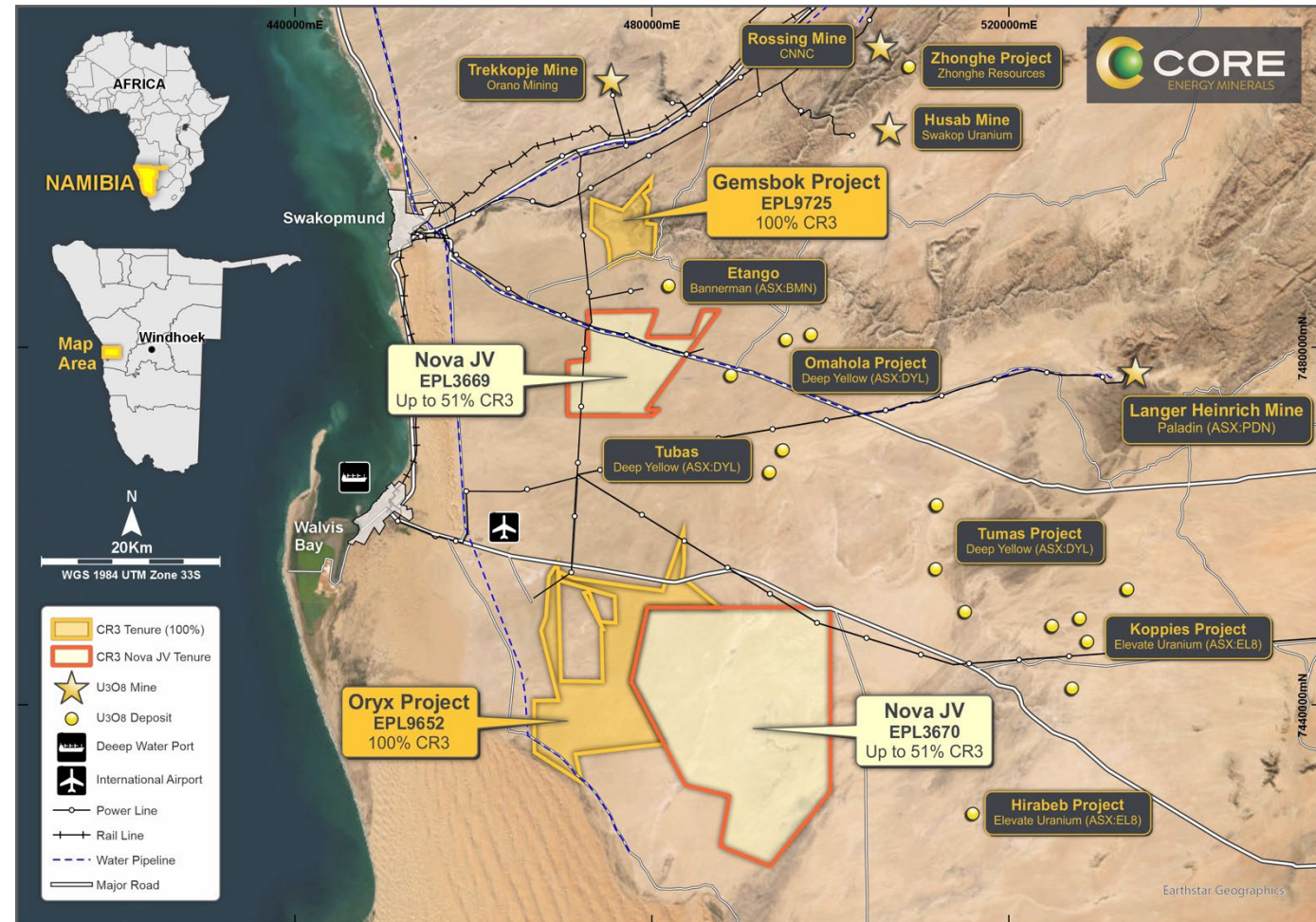

District Scale Uranium Tenure

Namibia's Premier Uranium Province, Erongo Region

- Strategic exploration package in Namibia's premier uranium province
- Prospective for both hard rock Alaskite-hosted and palaeochannel-hosted uranium mineralisation
- Port access (~50km) with existing uranium export, well-maintained roads, rail and established power networks
- In-country team in place to assess projects and navigate the Namibian regulatory system

Earn-In Agreement Tenements

EPL 3669

Hosts the Barking Gecko alaskite prospect with thick, high-grade intersections from RC and diamond drilling.

Additional basement targets include Iguana, Turtle's Neck and Speke's.

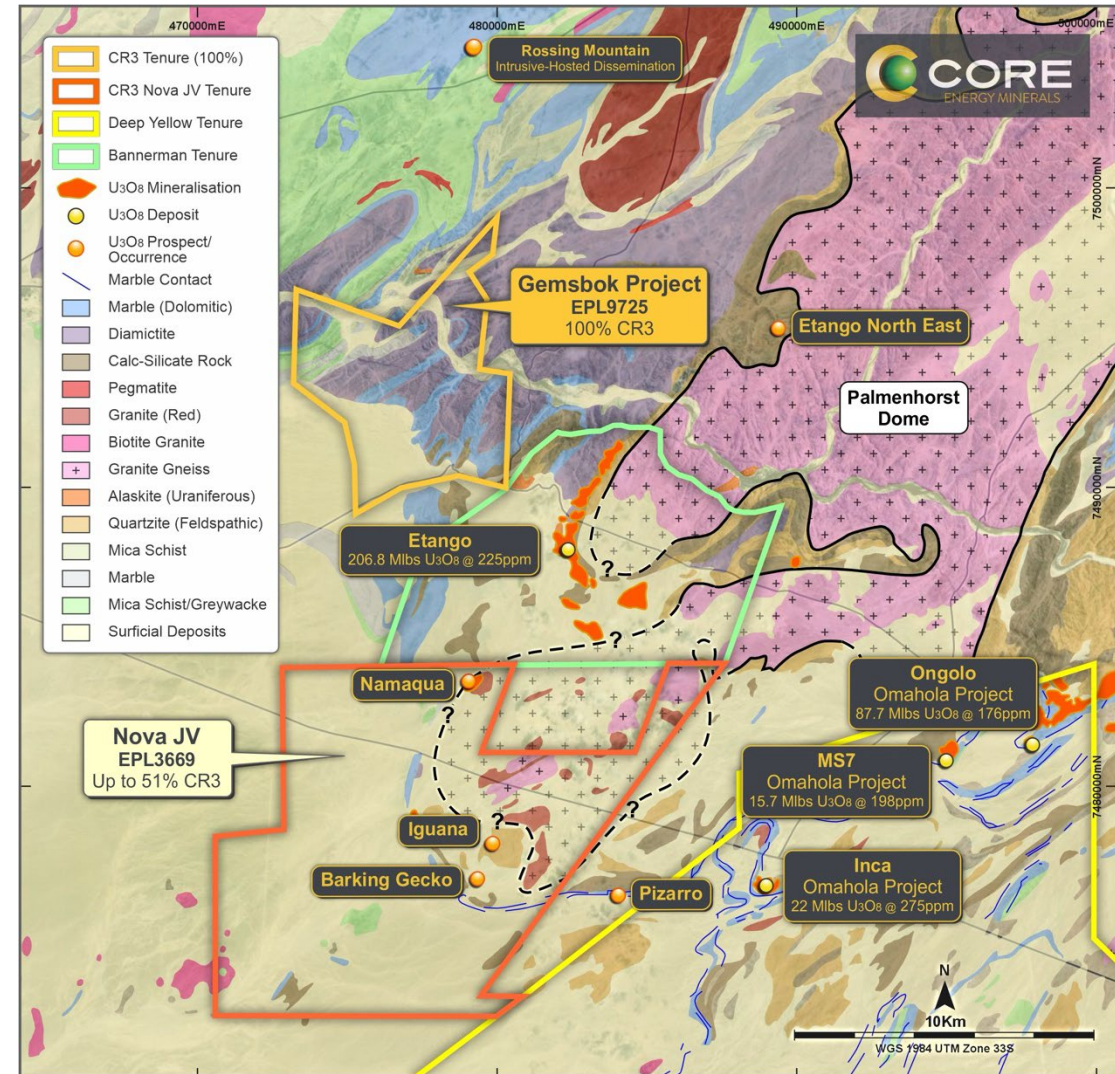
Also contains multiple palaeochannel targets including Namaqua, Bowsprit Channel and Berger's Cape Channel.

EPL 3670

Contains additional basement targets including Cape Flat (alaskite with >100ppm intersections). Plus, Day Gecko, Skink and Kuiseb palaeochannels.

Nova JV: Barking Gecko Prospect (*EPL3669*)

- Located adjacent to world class Etango Uranium Project (Bannerman Energy ASX: BMN)
- Proven geological setting for hard rock basement hosted Uranium Deposits
- Potential for a materially significant uranium system, based on historic RC and diamond drilling
- Multiple basement-hosted uranium systems identified, with multiple thick zones of uranium mineralisation
- Barking Gecko prospect, defined by 82 RC and Diamond drillholes, with high-grade mineralisation open at depth and along strike



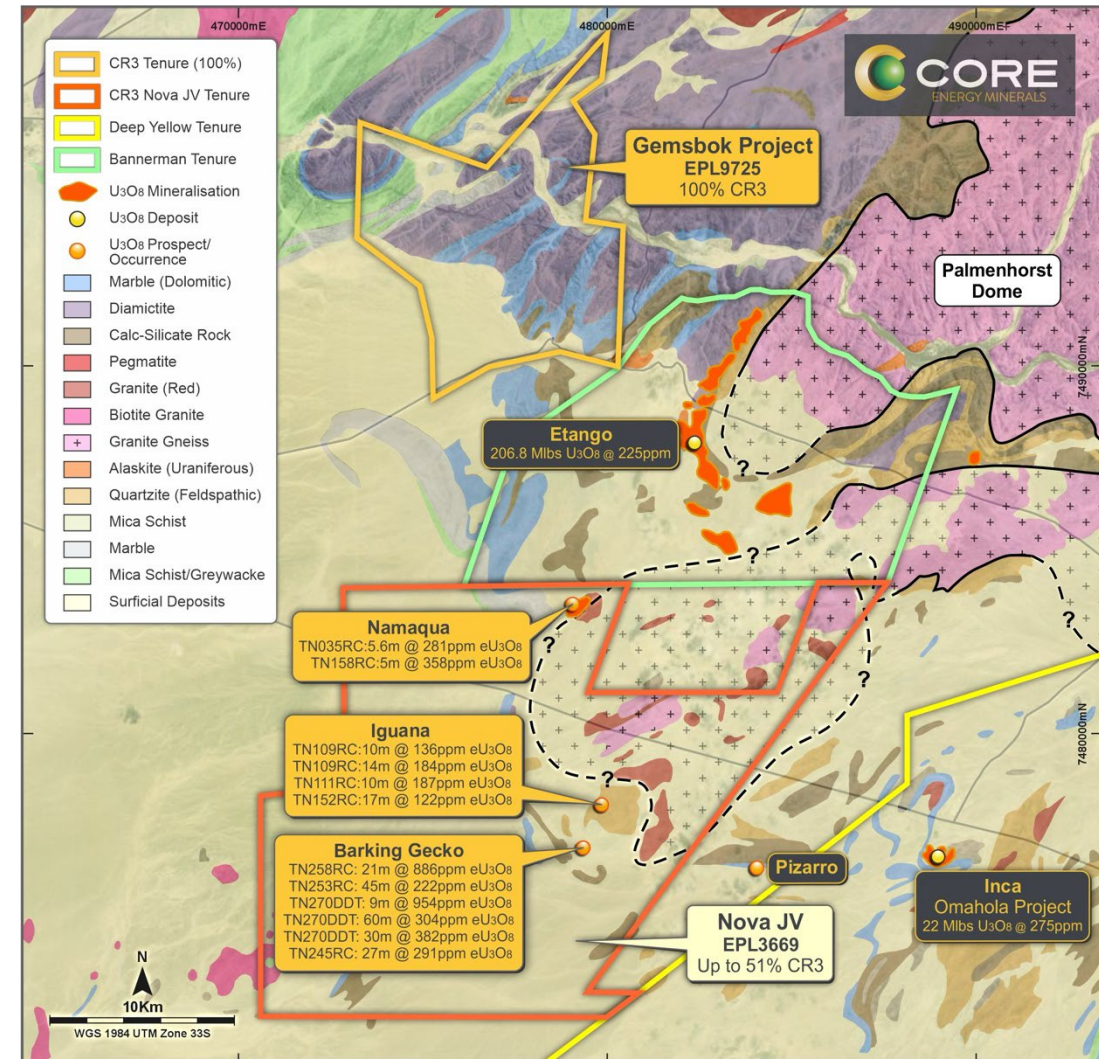

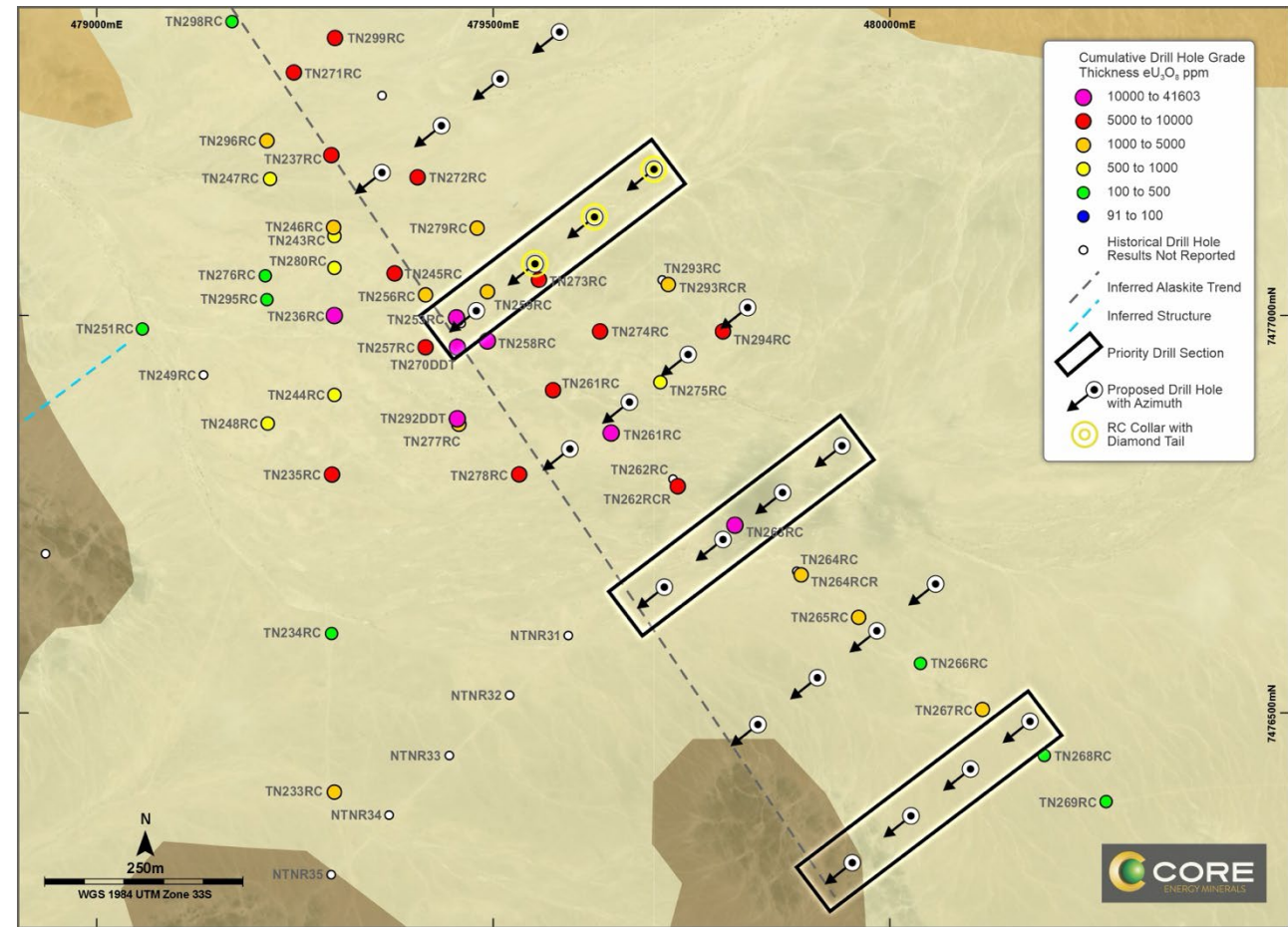


Nova JV: Barking Gecko Prospect, CR3 Proposed Drill Plan

Nova JV Project : Additional Targets, Basement and Palaeochannel Style

Basement Targets:

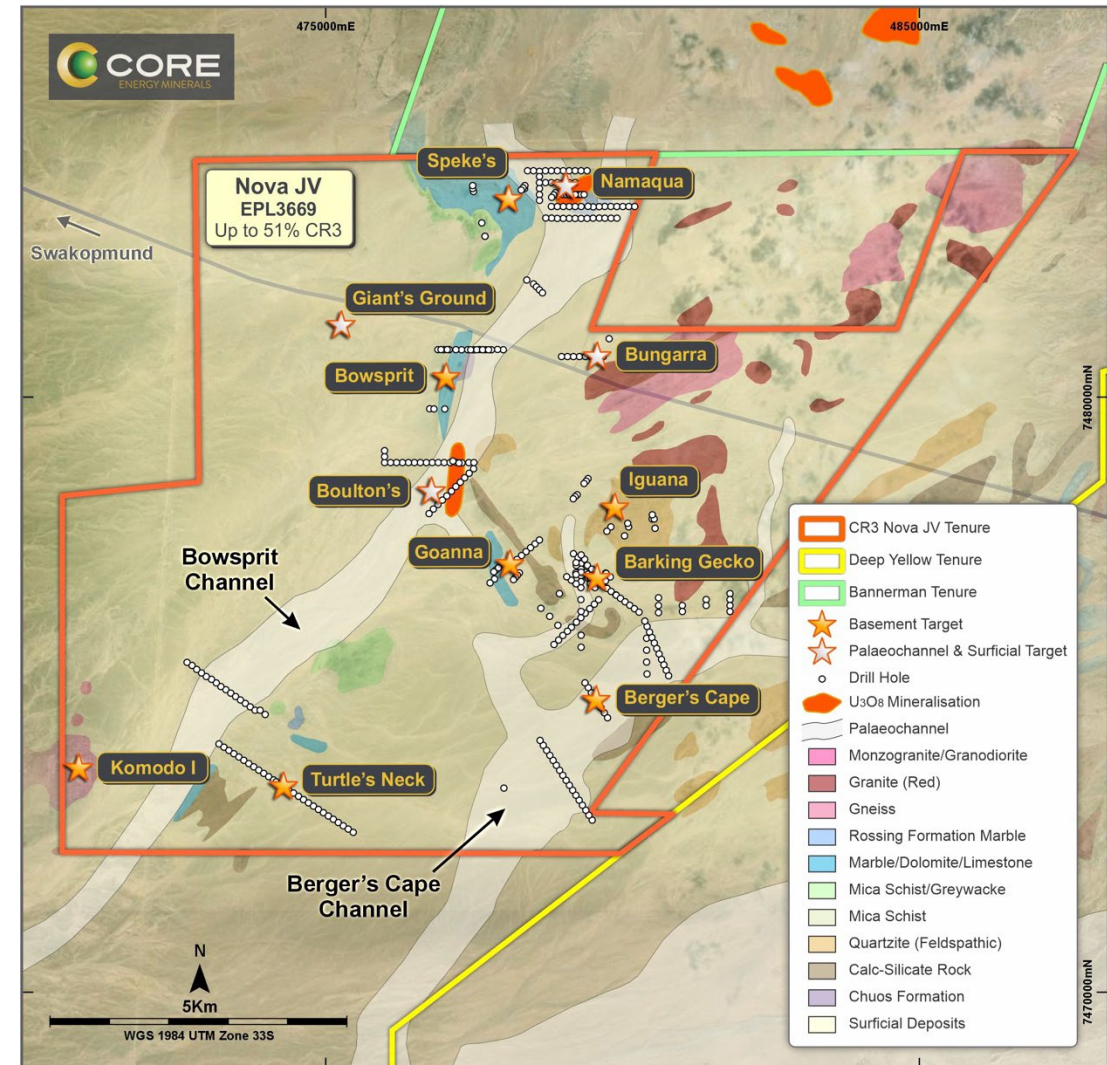
- **Iguana** – hydrothermal vein-style uranium in black quartz veins
- **Turtle's Neck** – shallow alaskite hosted uranium mineralisation
- **Speke's** – hydrothermal vein-style basement uranium mineralisation hosted in pyrite-rich quartzo-feldspathic basement rocks

Palaeochannel Targets:

Palaeochannels mapped using VTEM and drilling:

- **Bowsprit; Berger's Cape**

Mineralisation confirmed at **Namaqua, Boulton's**, with **5km of the Bowsprit channel remaining untested**

Nova JV Project: Additional Targets, Basement and Palaeochannel Style

Multiple basement and palaeochannel targets defined by geophysical and shallow drilling which require additional drill testing

Basement Targets:

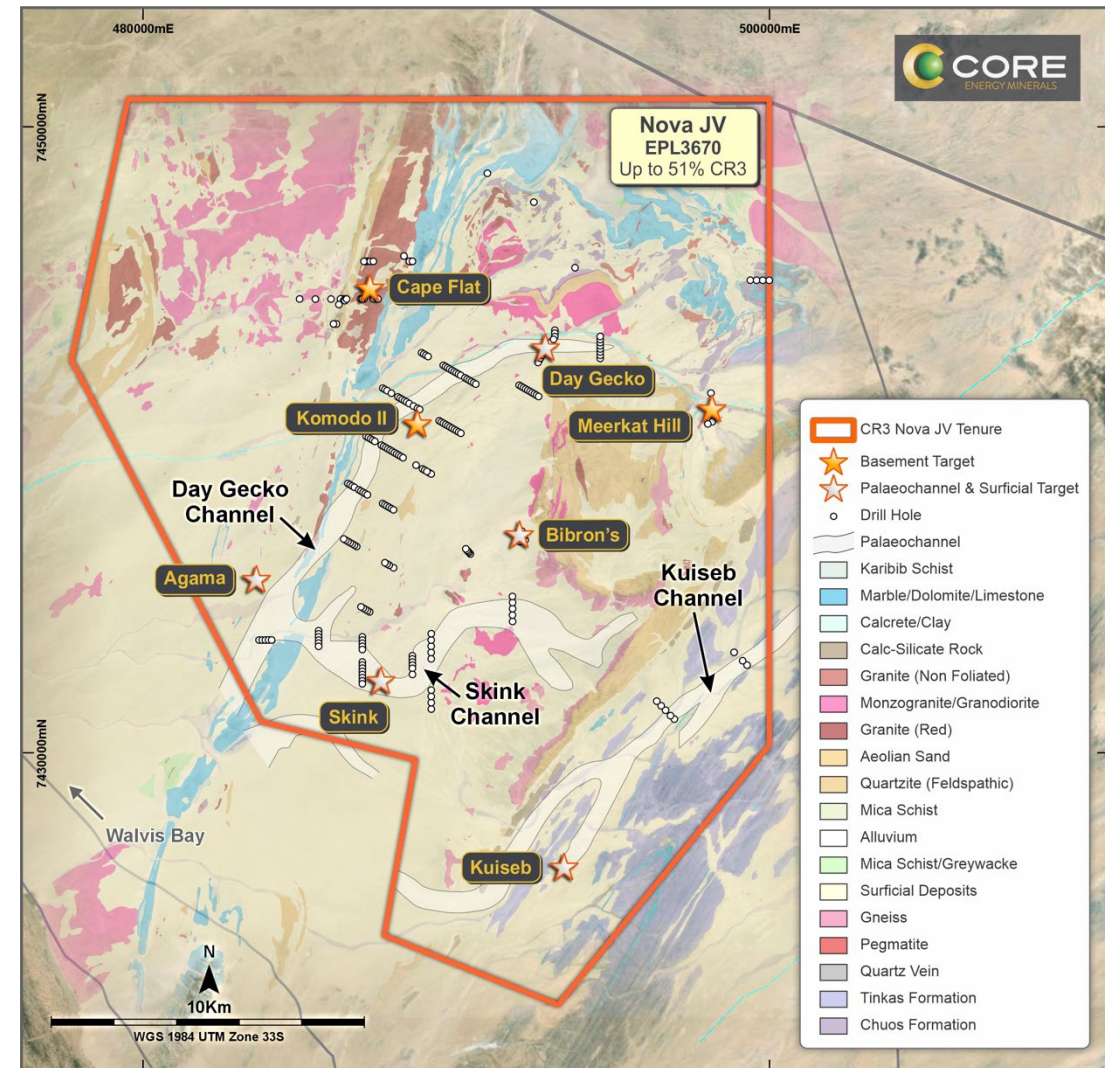
- **Cape Flat** – broad zone of alaskite hosted uranium mineralisation with multiple >100ppm intersections
- **Meerkat Hill** – uranium identified in conceptual target based on airborne radiometric anomalies in the hinge of a folded marble unit
- **Komodo II** – shallow uranium mineralisation hosted by Damaran lithologies dominated by granite, beneath palaeochannel mapped from VTEM

Palaeochannel Targets:

Four palaeochannels mapped using VTEM and drilling:

- **Day Gecko; Skink; Kuiseb; Agama**

Mineralisation confirmed at **Skink** with follow-up drilling recommended



Nova Uranium Project, Additional Targets

Multiple Deposit Styles, Multiple Opportunities

CR3 holds 100% interest in two greenfields uranium projects adjacent to the Nova JV area:

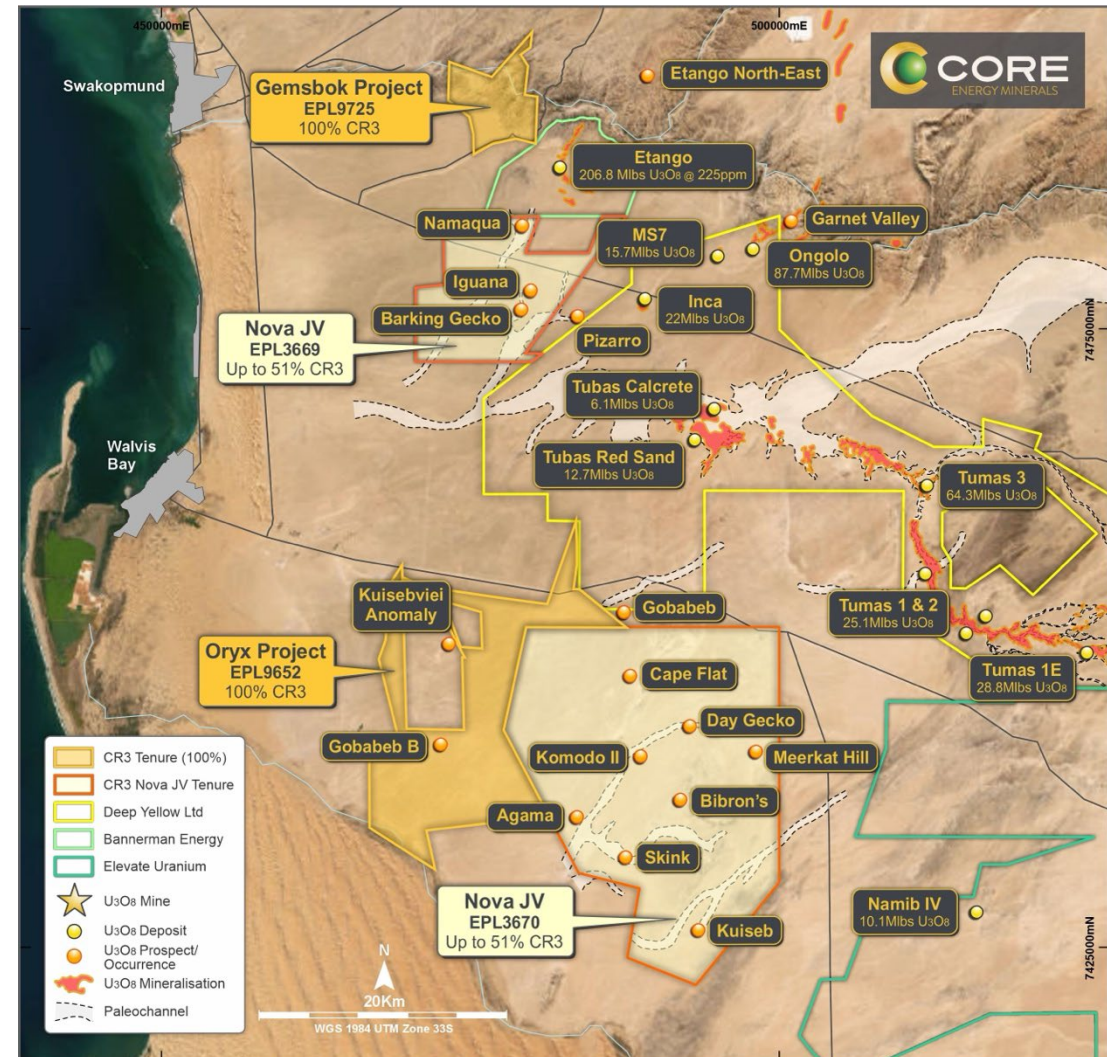
Gemsbok (EPL 9725)

- Located to the Northeast of Bannerman Energy (ASX:BMN) Etango Deposit which hosts 207MLbs of U_3O_8 *
- Similar geological setting as BMN's deposit, in an area favourable to hosting mineralised Alaskites

Oryx (EPL 9652)

- Located to the Southeast of Deep Yellow's (ASX:DYL) Tumas and Tubas deposits, hosting 120.9MLbs and 18.8MLbs of U_3O_8 * respectively
- Similar geological setting as DYL's deposits, in an interpreted calcrete horizon

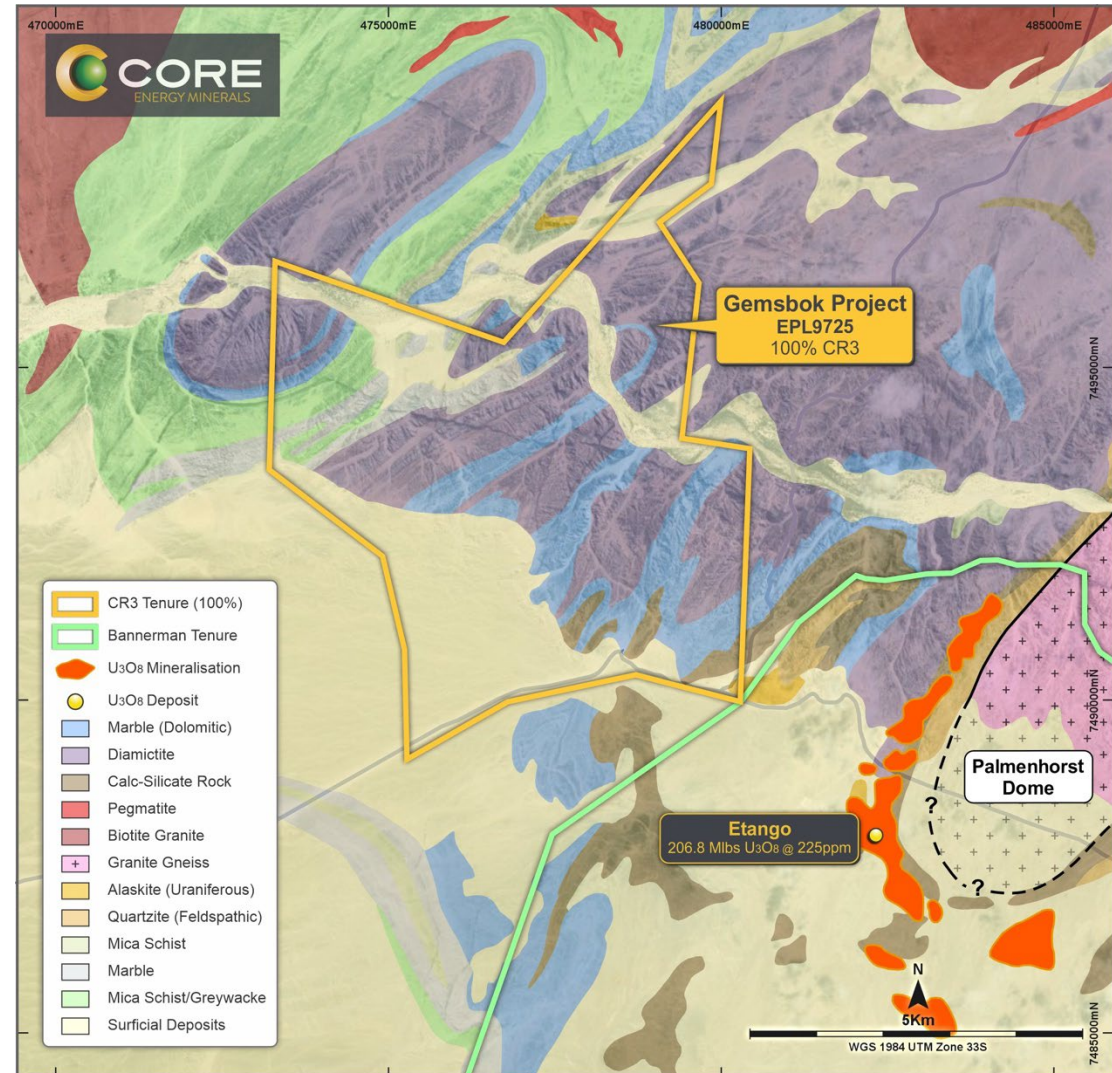


Gemsbok and Oryx locations (100% CR3)

Gemsbok Project (100% CR3)

High value, first mover exploration opportunity in one of the world's most productive uranium belts

- Located along the southern extension of Alaskite Alley, the same intrusive corridor hosting Etango, Husab and Rössing
- Gemsbok represents one of the last remaining underexplored gaps within this trend
- CR3's early reconnaissance and satellite imagery reveal compelling signs of a fertile intrusive system, extending into CR3's ground
- Dome-like structures elevate the potential for concealed intrusive centers with preserved cap rocks and associated uranium mineralisation

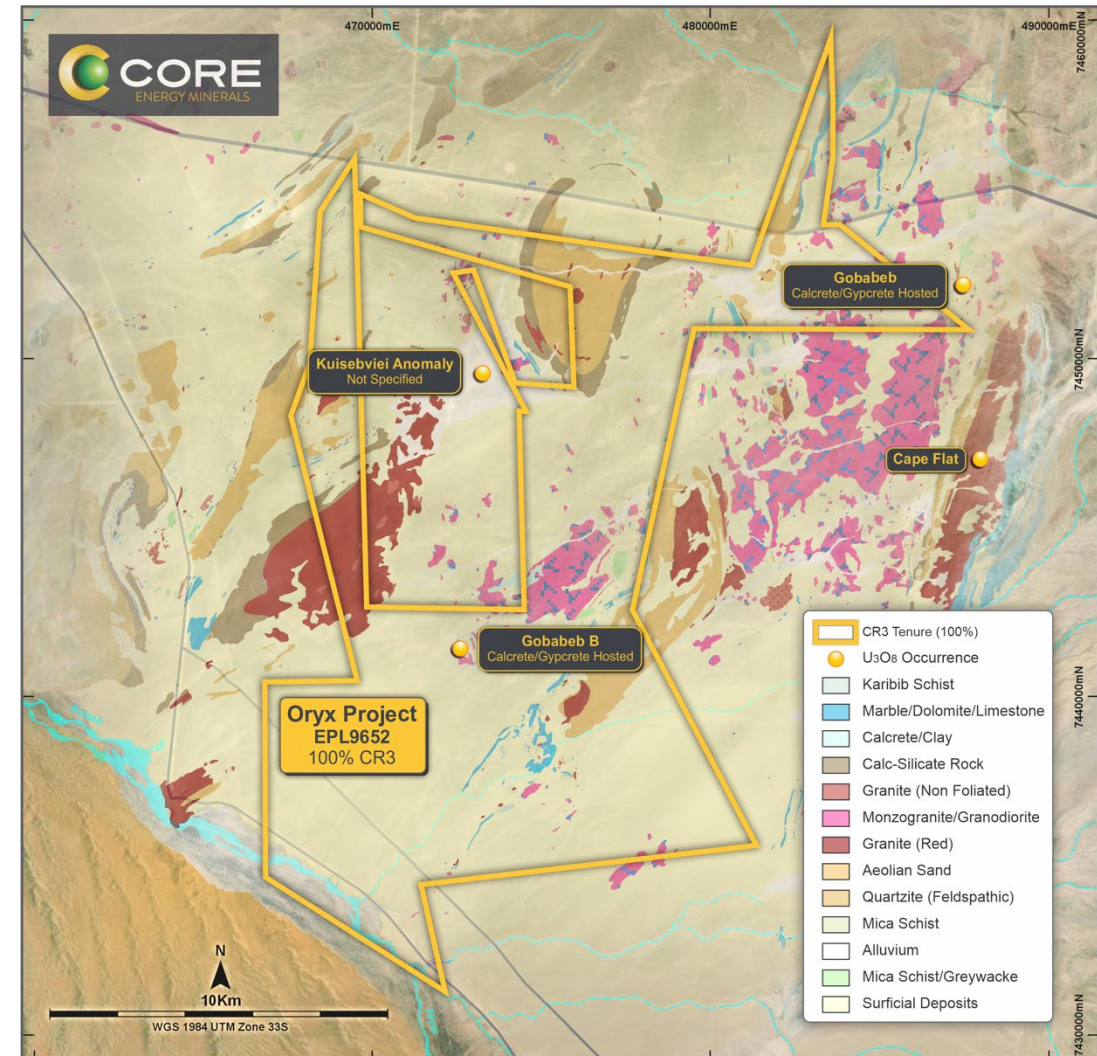


Gemsbok Project with regional geology and neighbouring uranium deposits

Oryx Project (100% CR3)

High priority target with extensive shallow cover, strong structural architecture and proximity to known mineralisation

- Positioned immediately south-east of the Deep Yellow's (ASX:DYL) Tumas palaeochannel system
- Regional geophysics shows that the Tumas palaeochannel branches and tributaries trend directly toward the Oryx license boundary
- Unexplored dome-like basement structures and is surrounded by nearby uranium occurrences, potential for alaskite systems
- Dual style potential, palaeochannel and basement, is rare and significantly enhances the exploration value of the project

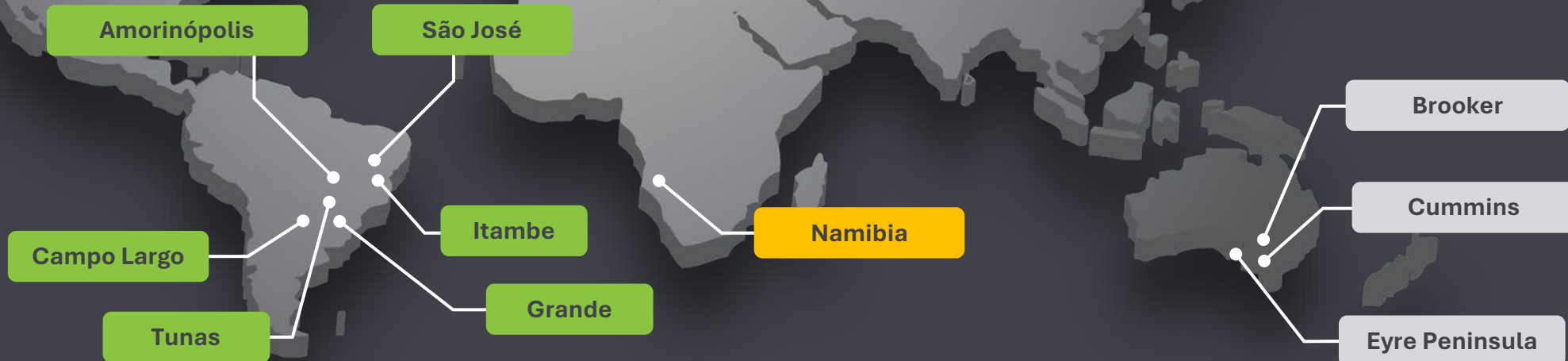

Brazil: Prospective Portfolio of Rare Earth Projects



Itambe – Bahia

- Located in a region host to world class REE projects, both hard rock and ionic clay.
- High quality historic soil sampling for immediate follow up.
- Technical, legal and environmental due diligence successfully completed.

Tunas - Paraná

- CR3 tenure surrounds the largest alkaline intrusive complex in Southern Brazil.
- Wide spaced auger drilling program returned thick REE intersections associated with saprolite clay horizons.
- Power auger sampling program underway to delineate drill targets.

Campo Largo - Paraná

- Exploration tenement located 60km southwest of Tunas.
- First pass drilling has returned widespread significant TREO with a very high proportion of MREO, up to 46% MREO from reconnaissance sampling.
