This Prospectus has been prepared primarily for the purpose of section 708A(11) of the Corporations Act to remove any trading restrictions on the sale of Shares issued by the Company prior to the Closing Date.

Clearing House Electronic Sub-Register System (CHES) and Issuer Sponsorship

The Company will apply to participate in CHES, for those investors who have, or wish to have, a sponsoring stockbroker. Investors who do not wish to participate through CHES will be issuer sponsored by the Company.

Electronic sub-registers mean that the Company will not be issuing certificates to investors. Instead, investors will be provided with statements (similar to a bank account statement) that set out the number of Securities issued to them under this Prospectus. The notice will also advise holders of their Holder Identification Number or Security Holder Reference Number and explain, for future reference, the sale and purchase procedures under CHES and issuer sponsorship.

Electronic sub-registers also mean ownership of securities can be transferred without having to rely upon paper

documentation. Further monthly statements will be provided to holders if there have been any changes in their security holding in the Company during the preceding month.

1.3 Background to the Offers

1.3.1 Placement

As announced on 31 October 2024, the Company is conducting a placement to issue up to 666,666,667 Shares to professional and sophisticated investors (**Placement Participants**) at an issue price of \$0.003 per Share, together with one (1) free attaching Option for every two (2) Shares subscribed for and issued rounded up for fractional entitlements), to raise up to \$2,000,000 (**Placement**).

Under the Placement, the Company will issue 84,044,460 Shares at an issue price of \$0.003 per Share to raise \$252,133 pursuant to Listing Rule 7.1 (**Tranche 1 Placement Shares**).

The following securities proposed to be issued under the Placement will be issued subject to Shareholder approval being attained at the Company's Annual General Meeting expected to be held on 29 November 2024:

- (a) 582,622,207 Shares (the subject of Resolution 8) (**Tranche 2 Placement Shares**); and
- (b) 333,333,333 Options (the subject of Resolution 9) (**Placement Options**).

The Company entered into an agreement for Canaccord Genuity (Australia) Limited (ACN 075 071 466) (AFSL 234666) (**Canaccord**) and CPS Capital Group Pty Ltd (ACN 088 055 636) (AFSL 294848) (**CPS**), to act as joint managers of the Placement (**Joint Lead Manager Agreement**). Under the Joint Lead Manager Agreement, the Company will pay/issue Canaccord and CPS collectively:

- (c) a cash fee of \$120,000 (being, 6% of the amount raised under the Placement and issue); and
- (d) 66,000,000 Options on the same terms as the Placement Options (subject to Shareholder approval) (**Broker Options**).

1.3.2 Annual General Meeting

On 31 October 2024, the Company released its notice of annual general meeting (**AGM**) which will be held on 29 November 2024 (**Notice of AGM**), which included resolutions seeking shareholder approval to issue:

- (a) 8,185,118 Shares to CPS Capital Group Pty Ltd in consideration for facilitation services provided to the Company (under Resolution 4) (**Facilitation Shares**); and
- (b) 83,333,333 Shares to Goldshore Investments Pty Ltd (an entity controlled by Managing Director Mr Malcolm Day) on conversion of \$250,000 of loan funds advanced to the Company (under Resolution 11) (**Loan Conversion Shares**).

For further information relating to these issues please refer to the Notice of AGM.

1.4 The Offers

1.4.1 Cleansing Offer

Pursuant to this Prospectus, the Company invites investors identified by the Directors to apply for up to 1,000 Shares at an issue price of \$0.004 per Share, to raise up to \$4 (before expenses).

The Offer will only be extended, and Application Forms will only be provided to specific parties on invitation from the Directors.

All of the Shares offered under this Prospectus will rank equally with the Shares on issue at the date of this Prospectus. Please refer to Section 3 for further information regarding the rights and liabilities attaching to the Shares.

1.4.2 Placement Option Offer

This Prospectus includes an offer of 333,333,333 Options to Placement Participants in connection with the Placement (**Placement Option Offer**). Accordingly, no funds will be raised from the issue of the Placement Options. The issue of Placement Options pursuant to the Placement Option Offer is subject to Shareholder approval at the Company's Annual General Meeting to be held on 29 November 2024. Only the Placement Participants may accept the Placement Option Offer and an Application Form in relation to the Placement Option Offer will be provided to Placement Participants, together with a copy of this Prospectus. The Placement Options offered under the Placement Option Offer will be issued on the terms and conditions set out in Section 3.2. All shares issued on exercise of the Placement Options will rank equally with the Shares on issue at the date of this Prospectus. Please refer to Section 3.1 for further information regarding the rights and liabilities attaching to the Shares.

1.4.3 Broker Offer

This Prospectus includes an offer of 66,000,000 Broker Options to Canaccord and CPS (or their nominees) as part consideration for the lead manager services provided to the Company in connection with the Placement (**Broker Offer**). Accordingly, no funds will be raised from the issue of the Broker Options. The issue of Broker Options pursuant to the Broker Offer is subject to Shareholder approval at the Company's Annual General Meeting to be held on 29 November 2024. Only Canaccord and CPS (or their nominees) may accept the Broker Offer and an Application Form in relation to the Broker Offer will be provided to Canaccord and CPS (or their nominees), together with a copy of this Prospectus. The Broker Options offered under the Broker Offer will be issued on the terms and conditions set out in Section 3.2. All shares issued on exercise of the Broker Options will rank equally with the Shares on issue at the date of this Prospectus. Please refer to Section 3.1 for further information regarding the rights and liabilities attaching to the Shares.

1.5 Objective

The primary purpose of this Prospectus is to remove any trading restrictions that may have attached to Shares issued by the Company without disclosure under Chapter 6D of the Corporations Act prior to the Closing Date (including prior to the date of this Prospectus). Accordingly, the Company is seeking to raise only a nominal amount of \$4 under this Prospectus as the purpose of this Prospectus is not to raise capital. The Company is not currently able to issue a cleansing notice under section 708A(5) of the Corporations Act due to its Shares having been suspended from trading on ASX for more than 5 trading days within the last 12 months. Accordingly, the primary purpose of this Prospectus is to remove any on-sale restrictions that may affect Shares that may be issued by the Company prior to the lodgement of this Prospectus or prior to the close of the Cleansing Offer.

The purpose of the Placement Option Offer is to satisfy the Company's obligations under the Placement and the purpose of the Broker Offer is to satisfy the Company's obligations under the Joint Lead Manager Mandate.

In addition to the above purposes, the Placement Option Offer and the Broker Offer are being made under this Prospectus to remove any trading restrictions attaching to the relevant Options, and any Shares issued on exercise of those Options. The Company confirms that:

- (a) the Placement Option Offer and the Broker Offer under this Prospectus are being issued with disclosure under this Prospectus (which is a disclosure document under Part 6D.2 of the Corporations Act); and
- (b) the Placement Option Offer and the Broker Offer are being made such that the relief provided under *ASIC Corporations (Sale Offers That Do Not Need Disclosure) Instrument 2016/80* with respect to the on-sale provisions of section 707 of the Corporations Act is available.

Relevantly, section 708A(11) of the Corporations Act provides that a sale offer does not need disclosure to investors if:

- (c) the relevant securities are in a class of securities that are quoted securities of the body; and
- (d) either:
 - (i) a prospectus is lodged with the ASIC on or after the day on which the relevant securities were issued but before the day on which the sale offer is made; or
 - (ii) a prospectus is lodged with ASIC before the day on which the relevant securities are issued and offers of securities that have been made under the prospectus are still open for acceptance on the day on which the relevant securities were issued; and
 - (iii) the prospectus is for an offer of securities issued by the body that are in the same class of securities as the relevant securities.

1.6 Application for Securities

(a) Applications for Shares under the Offer

Applications for Shares must be made by investors at the direction of the Company and must be made using the Application Form accompanying this Prospectus.

Payment for the Shares must be made in full at the issue price of \$0.004 per Share.

Completed Application Forms and accompanying cheques, made payable to "**Moab Minerals Ltd**" and crossed "**Not Negotiable**", must be mailed, or delivered to the Company at the address set out in the Application Form by no later than 5:00pm on the Closing Date.

(b) Applications for Placement Options under the Placement Options Offer

The Placement Option Offer will only be extended to Placement Participants. Application Forms will only be provided to Placement Participants.

(c) Applications for Broker Options under the Broker Options Offer

The Broker Offer will only be extended to Canaccord and CPS (or their nominees). Application Forms will only be provided to Canaccord and CPS (or their nominees).

1.7 Minimum subscription

There is no minimum subscription under the Offer.

1.8 Oversubscriptions

No oversubscriptions will be accepted by the Company under the Offer.

1.9 Underwriting

The Offer is not underwritten.

1.10 Issue of Shares

As noted in Section 1.5, the primary purpose of the Prospectus is to remove any trading restrictions that may have attached to Shares issued by the Company without disclosure under Chapter 6D of the Corporations Act prior to the Closing Date (including prior to the date of this Prospectus).

If the Directors decide to issue Shares under the Offer, the issue of Shares under the Offer will be issued in accordance with the ASX Listing Rules and will take place as soon as practicable after the Closing Date.

Application moneys will be held in a separate subscription account until the Shares are issued. This account will be established and kept by the Company in trust for each Applicant. Any interest earned on the application moneys will be for the benefit of the Company and will be retained by the Company irrespective of whether any Shares are issued and each Applicant waives the right to claim any interest.

The Directors will determine the recipients of all the Shares. The Directors reserve the right to reject any application or to allocate any Applicant fewer Shares than the number applied for. Where the number of Shares issued is less than the number applied for, the surplus monies will be returned by cheque as soon as practicable after the Closing Date. Where no issue of Shares is made, the amount tendered on application will be returned in full by cheque as soon as practicable after the Closing Date. Interest will not be paid on monies refunded.

The Company's decision on the number of Shares to be allocated to an Applicant will be final.

Holding statements for Shares issued under this Prospectus will be mailed as soon as practicable after the issue of Shares as soon as practicable after their issue.

1.11 ASX listing

Application for Official Quotation of the Shares offered pursuant to this Prospectus will be made within 7 days after the date of this Prospectus. If ASX does not grant Official Quotation of the Shares offered pursuant to this Prospectus before the expiration of three months after the date of issue of the Prospectus, (or such period as varied by the ASIC), the Company will not issue any Shares and will repay all Application monies for the Shares within the time prescribed under the Corporations Act, without interest.

As such, the Offer will have an effect on the Company's financial position, being receipt of funds of \$4 less costs of making the Offer of approximately \$8,206.

3. RIGHTS AND LIABILITIES ATTACHING TO SECURITIES

3.1 Rights and liabilities attaching to Shares

The following is a summary of the more significant rights and liabilities attaching to Shares being offered pursuant to this Prospectus. This summary is not exhaustive and does not constitute a definitive statement of the rights and liabilities of Shareholders. To obtain such a statement, persons should seek independent legal advice.

Full details of the rights and liabilities attaching to Shares are set out in the Constitution, a copy of which is available for inspection at the Company's registered office during normal business hours.

(a) General meetings

Shareholders are entitled to be present in person, or by proxy, attorney or representative to attend and vote at general meetings of the Company. The Company's constitution permits the use of technology at general meetings of shareholders (including wholly virtual meetings) to the extent permitted under the Corporations Act, Listing Rules and applicable law.

Shareholders may requisition meetings in accordance with section 249D of the Corporations Act and the Constitution of the Company.

(b) Voting rights

Subject to any rights or restrictions for the time being attached to any class or classes of shares, at general meetings of shareholders or classes of shareholders:

- (i) each Shareholder entitled to vote may vote in person or by proxy, attorney or representative;
- (ii) on a show of hands, every person present who is a Shareholder or a proxy, attorney or representative of a Shareholder has one vote; and
- (iii) on a poll, every person present who is a Shareholder or a proxy, attorney or representative of a Shareholder shall, in respect of each fully paid Share held by him, or in respect of which he is appointed a proxy, attorney or representative, have one vote for each Share held, but in respect of partly paid shares shall have such number of votes as bears the same proportion to the total of such Shares registered in the Shareholder's name as the amount paid (not credited) bears to the total amounts paid and payable (excluding amounts credited).

(c) Dividend rights

Subject to the rights of any preference Shareholders and to the rights of the holders of any shares created or raised under any special arrangement as to dividend, the Directors may from time to time declare a dividend to be paid to the Shareholders entitled to the dividend which shall be payable on all Shares according to the proportion that the amount paid (not credited) is of the total amounts paid and payable (excluding amounts credited) in respect of such Shares.

The Directors may from time to time pay to the Shareholders any interim dividends as they may determine. No dividend shall carry interest as against the Company. The Directors may set aside out of the profits of the Company any amounts that they may determine as reserves, to be applied at the discretion of the Directors, for any purpose for which the profits of the Company may be properly applied.

Subject to the ASX Listing Rules and the Corporations Act, the Company may, by resolution of the Directors, implement a dividend reinvestment plan on such terms and conditions as the Directors think fit and which provides for any dividend which the Directors may declare from time to time payable on Shares which are participating Shares in the dividend reinvestment plan, less any amount which the Company shall either pursuant to the Constitution or any law

be entitled or obliged to retain, be applied by the Company to the payment of the subscription price of Shares.

(d) **Winding-up**

If the Company is wound up, the liquidator may, with the authority of a special resolution, divide among the Shareholders in kind the whole or any part of the property of the Company, and may for that purpose set such value as he considers fair upon any property to be so divided, and may determine how the division is to be carried out as between the Shareholders or different classes of Shareholders.

The liquidator may, with the authority of a special resolution, vest the whole or any part of any such property in trustees upon such trusts for the benefit of the contributories as the liquidator thinks fit, but so that no Shareholder is compelled to accept any shares or other securities in respect of which there is any liability.

(e) **Shareholder liability**

As the Shares issued will be fully paid shares, they will not be subject to any calls for money by the Directors and will therefore not become liable for forfeiture.

(f) **Transfer of shares**

Generally, shares in the Company are freely transferable, subject to formal requirements, the registration of the transfer not resulting in a contravention of or failure to observe the provisions of a law of Australia and the transfer not being in breach of the Corporations Act and the ASX Listing Rules.

(g) **Future increase in capital**

The issue of any new Shares is under the control of the Directors of the Company. Subject to restrictions on the issue or grant of Shares contained in the ASX Listing Rules, the Constitution and the Corporations Act (and without affecting any special right previously conferred on the holder of an existing share or class of shares), the Directors may issue Shares as they shall, in their absolute discretion, determine.

(h) **Variation of rights**

Under section 246B of the Corporations Act, the Company may, with the sanction of a special resolution passed at a meeting of Shareholders vary or abrogate the rights attaching to Shares.

If at any time the share capital is divided into different classes of shares, the rights attached to any class (unless otherwise provided by the terms of issue of the shares of that class), whether or not the Company is being wound up, may be varied or abrogated with the consent in writing of the holders of three quarters of the issued shares of that class, or if authorised by a special resolution passed at a separate meeting of the holders of the shares of that class.

(i) **Alteration of Constitution**

In accordance with the Corporations Act, the Constitution can only be amended by a special resolution passed by at least three quarters of Shareholders present and voting at the general meeting. In addition, at least 28 days written notice specifying the intention to propose the resolution as a special resolution must be given.

3.2 Rights and liabilities attaching to Placement Options and Broker Options

(a) **Entitlement**

Each Option entitles the holder to subscribe for one Share upon exercise of the Option.

(b) **Exercise Price**

Subject to paragraph (j), the amount payable upon exercise of each Option will be \$0.008 (**Exercise Price**).

(c) **Expiry Date**

Each Option will expire at 5:00 pm (WST) three (3) years from their date of issue (**Expiry Date**). An Option not exercised before the Expiry Date will automatically lapse on the Expiry Date.

(d) **Exercise Period**

The Options are exercisable at any time on or prior to the Expiry Date (**Exercise Period**).

(e) **Notice of Exercise**

The Options may be exercised during the Exercise Period by notice in writing to the Company in the manner specified on the Option certificate (**Notice of Exercise**) and payment of the Exercise Price for each Option being exercised in Australian currency by electronic funds transfer or other means of payment acceptable to the Company.

(f) **Exercise Date**

A Notice of Exercise is only effective on and from the later of the date of receipt of the Notice of Exercise and the date of receipt of the payment of the Exercise Price for each Option being exercised in cleared funds (**Exercise Date**).

(g) **Timing of issue of Shares on exercise**

Within five Business Days after the Exercise Date, the Company will:

- (i) issue the number of Shares required under these terms and conditions in respect of the number of Options specified in the Notice of Exercise and for which cleared funds have been received by the Company;
- (ii) if required, give ASX a notice that complies with section 708A(5)(e) of the Corporations Act, or, if the Company is unable to issue such a notice, lodge with ASIC a prospectus prepared in accordance with the Corporations Act and do all such things necessary to satisfy section 708A(11) of the Corporations Act to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors; and
- (iii) if admitted to the official list of ASX at the time, apply for official quotation on ASX of Shares issued pursuant to the exercise of the Options.
- (iv) suant to the exercise of the Options.

If a notice delivered under (g)(ii) for any reason is not effective to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors, the Company must, no later than 20 Business Days after becoming aware of such notice being ineffective, lodge with ASIC a prospectus prepared in accordance with the Corporations Act and do all such things necessary to satisfy section 708A(11) of the Corporations Act to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors.

(h) **Shares issued on exercise**

Shares issued on exercise of the Options rank equally with the then issued shares of the Company.

(i) **Quotation of Shares issued on exercise**

Application will be made by the Company to ASX for quotation of the Shares issued upon exercise of the Options.

(j) **Reconstruction of capital**

If at any time the issued capital of the Company is reconstructed, all rights of an Optionholder are to be changed in a manner consistent with the Corporations Act and the ASX Listing Rules at the time of the reconstruction.

(k) **Participation in new issues**

There are no participation rights or entitlements inherent in the Options and holders will not be entitled to participate in new issues of capital offered to Shareholders during the currency of the Options without exercising the Options.

(l) **Change in exercise price**

An Option does not confer the right to a change in Exercise Price or a change in the number of underlying securities over which the Option can be exercised.

(m) **Transferability**

The Options are transferable subject to any restriction or escrow arrangements imposed by ASX or under applicable Australian securities laws.

4. RISK FACTORS

4.1 Introduction

The Securities offered under this Prospectus should be considered as highly speculative and an investment in the Company is not risk free.

The Directors strongly recommend that prospective investors to consider the risk factors set out in this Section 4, together with information contained in this Prospectus.

The future performance of the Company and the value of the Shares may be influenced by a range of factors, many of which are largely beyond the control of the Company and the Directors. The key risks associated with the Company's business, the industry in which it operates and general risks applicable to all investments in listed securities and financial markets generally are described below.

The risks factors set out in this Section 4, or other risk factors not specifically referred to, may have a materially adverse impact on the performance of the Company and the value of the Shares. This Section 4 is not intended to provide an exhaustive list of the risk factors to which the Company is exposed.

If you do not understand any matters contained in this Prospectus or have any queries about whether to invest in the Company, you should consult your accountant, financial adviser, stockbroker, lawyer or other professional adviser.

4.2 Company specific

Additional requirements for capital	The Company's capital requirements depend on numerous factors. Depending on the Company's ability to generate income from its operations, the Company may require further financing to develop its business. Any additional equity financing will dilute shareholdings, and debt financing, if available, may involve restrictions on financing and operating activities. If the Company is unable to obtain additional financing as needed, it may be required to reduce the scope of its operations and scale back its exploration programmes as the case may be. There is however no guarantee that the Company will be able to secure any additional funding or be able to secure funding on terms favourable to the Company.
Climate Risk	There are a number of climate-related factors that may affect the operations and proposed activities of the Company. The climate change risks particularly attributable to the Company include: (a) the emergence of new or expanded regulations associated with the transitioning to a lower-carbon economy and market changes related to climate change mitigation. The Company may be impacted by changes to local or international compliance regulations related to climate change mitigation efforts, or by specific taxation or penalties for carbon emissions or environmental damage. These examples sit amongst an array of possible restraints on industry that may further impact the Company and its profitability. While the Company will endeavour to manage these risks and limit any consequential impacts, there can be no guarantee that the Company will not be impacted by these occurrences; and (a) climate change may cause certain physical and environmental risks that cannot be predicted by the Company, including events such as increased severity of weather patterns and incidence of extreme weather events and longer-term physical risks such as shifting

	climate patterns. All these risks associated with climate change may significantly change the industry in which the Company operates.
Related Party Risk	The Company has a number of key contractual relationships with related parties. If these relationships breakdown and the related party agreements are terminated, there is a risk that the Company may not be able to find a satisfactory replacement. Further, the operations of the Company will require involvement of related parties and other third parties including suppliers, manufacturers and customers. With respect to these persons and despite applying best practice in terms of pre-contracting due diligence, the Company is unable to completely avoid the risk of: (a) financial failure or default by a participant in any agreement to which the Company may become a party; and/or (b) insolvency, default on performance or delivery by any operators, contractors or service providers. There is also a risk that where the Company has engaged a contractor who is a related party, the contract between the contractor and the Company may terminate for reasons outside of the control of the Company. This may then result in the termination of the contract between the Company and the contractor and the impact the Company's position, performance and reputation.
Jurisdiction Risk	United States of America Some of the Company's existing projects are located outside Australia, specifically in the United States of America. As a result, it may be difficult to enforce judgments obtained in Australian courts against those assets. In addition, there is uncertainty as to whether the courts of the United States of America or any other jurisdiction in which the Company may operate would recognise or enforce judgments of Australian courts based on provisions of the laws of Australia. Furthermore, because the majority of the Company's assets are or will be located outside Australia, it may be difficult to access those assets to satisfy an award entered for the Company in Australia. Consequently, Shareholders may have more difficulty in protecting their interests as a result of actions taken by management, the Board or controlling Shareholders than they would as shareholders of a company with assets in Australia. Tanzania The Manyoni Uranium Project and the Octavo Uranium Project that the Company acquired under the Acquisition are located in Tanzania and will be subject to the various political, economic and other risks and uncertainties associated with operating in that country. These risks and uncertainties include, but are not limited to, economic, social or political instability or change, hyperinflation, currency non-convertibility or instability and changes of law affecting government participation, taxation, working conditions, rates of exchange, exchange control, exploration licensing, export duties, environmental protection, mine safety, labour relations as well as government control over mineral properties or government regulations that require the employment of local staff or contractors or require other benefits to be provided to local residents. 	may also be hindered or prevented from enforcing its rights with respect to a governmental instrumentality because of the doctrine of sovereign immunity. Any future material adverse changes in government policies or legislation in Tanzania that affect foreign ownership, mineral exploration, development or mining activities, may affect the viability and profitability of the Company. Operations may be affected in varying degrees by government regulations with respect to, but not limited to, restrictions on exploration, development, mining production, price controls, export controls, currency remittance, income taxes, foreign investment, maintenance of claims, environmental legislation, land use, land claims of local people, water use, local economic empowerment or similar policies, employment, contractor selection and mine safety. Failure to comply strictly with applicable laws, regulations and local practices relating to mineral right applications and tenure, could result in loss, reduction or expropriation of entitlements. The occurrence of these various factors adds uncertainties that cannot be accurately predicted and could have an adverse effect on the Company's operations or profitability. The legal systems in Tanzania may be less developed than in more established countries, which may result in risks such as political difficulties in obtaining effective legal redress in the courts whether in respect of a breach of law or regulation, or in an ownership dispute; a higher degree of discretion on the part of governmental agencies; the lack of political or administrative guidance on implementing applicable rules and regulations including, in particular, as regards to local taxation and property rights; inconsistencies or conflicts between and within various laws, regulations, decrees, orders and resolutions, or relative inexperience of the judiciary and courts in such matters. The commitment by local business people, governmental officials and agencies and the judicial system to abide by legal requirements and negotiated agreements may be more uncertain, creating particular concerns with respect to licences and agreements for the Company. These may be susceptible to revision or cancellation and legal redress may be uncertain or delayed. There can be no assurance that joint ventures, licences, licence applications or other legal arrangements will not be adversely affected by the actions of the government authorities or others and the effectiveness and enforcement of such arrangements cannot be assured. There can be no guarantee that the Company will be able to generate a positive return for its shareholders if an event occurs in Tanzania which materially adversely affects the value of the Company, its assets and/or its business. Environmental and other regulatory risks in Tanzania Environmental laws in Tanzania are strict. Every activity from exploration through to mining requires compliance with the regulations for environmental protections in section 81 of the Environmental Management Act, 2004. Under section 81, an Environmental Impact Assessment Report is a mandatory requirement, and the outcome of the assessment may be negative. It is expected that the Company's activities will have an impact on the environment, particularly at the time of advanced exploration and any mine development.

	It is in the interest of the Company to conduct its activities to the highest standard of environmental obligation, including compliance with all environmental laws, in order to minimise damage to the environment and risk of liability. It is to be expected that there are certain risks inherent to the Company's activities, such as accidental spills, leakages or other unforeseen circumstances, which could subject the Company to environmental liability. Tanzanian environmental laws are dynamic and can change over time. The Company is unable to predict the effect of additional environmental laws and regulations that may be adopted in the future. Additional laws or regulations may materially increase the Company's cost of doing business or affect its operations. The cost and complexity of complying with any additional environmental laws and regulations may prevent the Company from being able to develop potentially viable mineral deposits.
Reserve and Resource Estimates	No assurance can be given that any estimated reserves and resources that are estimated by the Company will be recovered or that they will be recovered at the rates estimated. Mineral reserve and resource estimates are based on limited sampling, and, consequently, are uncertain because the samples may not be representative. Mineral reserve and resource estimates may require revision (either up or down) based on actual production experience. Any future reserve and/or resource figures will be estimates and there can be no assurance that the minerals are present, will be recovered or that it can be brought into profitable production. Furthermore, a decline in the market price for natural resources that the Company may discover or invest in could render reserves containing relatively lower grades of these resources uneconomic to recover and may ultimately result in a restatement of reserves.
Investments	The Company's assets include shares in European Lithium Limited (ASX: EUR). As the securities are quoted on the ASX, there is a risk that the value of these assets may fluctuate in value. The Company's assets also includes shares in CAA Mining Limited. As the securities are unquoted, there is a risk that the value of these assets may fluctuate in value.

4.3 Industry specific

Environmental	The operations and proposed activities of the Company are subject to laws and regulations concerning the environment. As with most exploration projects and mining operations, the Company's activities are expected to have an impact on the environment, particularly if advanced exploration or mine development proceeds. It is the Company's intention to conduct its activities to the highest standard of environmental obligation, including compliance with all environmental laws. Mining operations have inherent risks and liabilities associated with safety and damage to the environment and the disposal of waste products occurring as a result of mineral exploration and production. The occurrence of any such safety or environmental incident could delay production or increase production costs. Events, such as unpredictable rainfall or bushfires may impact on the Company's ongoing compliance with environmental legislation, regulations and licences. Significant liabilities could be imposed on the Company for damages, clean-up costs or penalties in the event of certain discharges into the environment, environmental damage caused by previous operations or non-compliance with

	environmental laws or regulations. The disposal of mining and process waste and mine water discharge are under constant legislative scrutiny and regulation. There is a risk that environmental laws and regulations become more onerous making the Company's operations more expensive. Approvals are required for land clearing and for ground disturbing activities. Delays in obtaining such approvals can result in the delay to anticipated exploration programmes or mining activities.

No assurance can be given that the Company will achieve commercial viability through the development or mining of its projects and treatment of ore.
Insurance risks	There are significant exploration and operating risks associated with exploring for minerals (including base metals, gold, cobalt), including adverse weather conditions, environmental risks and fire, all of which can result in injury to persons as well as damage to or destruction of the extraction plant, equipment, production facilities and other property. In addition, the Company's subsidiaries will be subject to liability for environmental risks such as pollution and abuse of the environment. The occurrences of a significant event against which the Company is not fully insured could have a material adverse effect on its operations and financial performance. In addition, in the future some or all of the Company's insurance coverage may become unavailable or prohibitively expensive.
Commodity price volatility and exchange rate risks	If the Company achieves success leading to mineral production, the revenue it will derive through the sale of commodities exposes the potential income of the Company to commodity price and exchange rate risks. Commodity prices fluctuate and are affected by many factors beyond the control of the Company. Such factors include supply and demand fluctuations for precious and base metals, technological advancements, forward selling activities and other macro-economic factors. Furthermore, international prices of various commodities are denominated in United States dollars, whereas the income and expenditure of the Company are and will be taken into

Any such claim or dispute if proven, may impact adversely on the Company's operations, financial performance and financial position. The Company is not currently engaged in any litigation.
Dividends	Any future determination as to the payment of dividends by the Company will be at the discretion of the Directors and will depend on the financial condition of the Company, future capital requirements and general business and other factors considered relevant by the Directors. No assurance in relation to the payment of dividends or franking credits attaching to dividends can be given by the Company.
Taxation	The acquisition and disposal of Shares will have tax consequences, which will differ depending on the individual financial affairs of each investor. All prospective investors in the Company are urged to obtain independent financial advice about the consequences of acquiring Shares from a taxation viewpoint and generally. To the maximum extent permitted by law, the Company, its officers and each of their respective advisors accept no liability and responsibility with respect to the taxation consequences of

Reliance on key personnel	The responsibility of overseeing the day-to-day operations and the strategic management of the Company depends substantially on its senior management and its key personnel. There can be no assurance given that there will be no detrimental impact on the Company if one or more of these employees cease their employment.

The Company is monitoring the situation closely and considers the impact of the Ukraine and Gaza Conflicts on the Company's business and financial performance to, at this stage, be limited. However, the situation is continually evolving, and the consequences are therefore inevitably uncertain.
Acquisitions	As part of its business strategy, the Company may make acquisitions of, or significant investments in, companies, assets, or projects complementary to the Company's existing operations. Any such future transactions are accompanied by the risks commonly encountered in making acquisitions of companies, assets and projects, such as integrating cultures and systems of operation, relocation of operations, short term strain on working capital requirements, achieving the short-term operational goals and retaining key staff and customer and supplier relationships.
