For a pro-rata non-renounceable entitlement issue of up to 219,656,079 New Options, on the basis of one (1) New Option for every two (2) Shares held by those Shareholders registered at the Record Date at an issue price of \$0.003 per New Option, exercisable at \$0.03 each on or before the date that is 18 months from the date of issue, to raise up to approximately \$658,968 (based on the number of Shares on issue as at the date of this Prospectus) (**Offer**).

Financial forecasts

The Directors have considered the matters set out in ASIC Regulatory Guide 170 and believe that they do not have a reasonable basis to forecast future earnings on the basis that the operations of the Company are inherently uncertain. Accordingly, any forecast or projection information would contain such a broad range of potential outcomes and possibilities that it is not possible to prepare a reliable best estimate forecast or projection.

Clearing House Electronic Sub-Register System (CHES) and Issuer Sponsorship

The Company will apply to participate in CHES, for those investors who have, or wish to have, a sponsoring stockbroker. Investors who do not wish to participate through CHES will be issuer sponsored by the Company.

Electronic sub-registers mean that the Company will not be issuing certificates to investors. Instead, investors will be provided with statements (similar to a bank account statement) that set out the number of New Options issued to them under this Prospectus. The notice will also advise holders of their Holder Identification Number or Security Holder Reference Number and explain, for future reference, the sale and purchase procedures under CHES and issuer sponsorship.

Electronic sub-registers also mean ownership of securities can be transferred without having to rely upon paper documentation. Further monthly statements will be provided to holders if there have been any changes in

their security holding in the Company during the preceding month.

1.3 Key Risk Factors

Prospective investors should be aware that subscribing for New Options involves a number of risks and an investment in the Company should be considered as highly speculative. The future performance of the Company and the value of the New Options may be influenced by a range of factors, many of which are largely beyond the control of the Company and the Directors. The key risks associated with the Company's business, the industry in which it operates and general risks applicable to all investments in listed securities and financial markets generally are set out in Section 5.

The Board recommends all Shareholders take up their Entitlements. The Directors reserve the right to take up their respective Entitlement in whole or in part at their discretion.

1.5 Details of Substantial Holders

Based on publicly available information as at the date of this Prospectus, the Company does not have any substantial holders prior to the Offer.

1.6 Lead Manager

Euroz Hartleys Limited (AFSL 230 052) will be lead manager to the Offer (**Lead Manager**), pursuant to an existing advisory and capital raising agreement. As Lead Manager, Euroz Hartleys Limited will receive a transaction fee equivalent to 6% of the gross amount raised under the Offer.

The Lead Manager and parties associated with the Lead Manager hold 22,500,000 unlisted options in the Company. 16,000,000 unlisted options were approved by Shareholders at the Company's Annual General Meeting held on 22 November 2024, of which 8,000,000 are exercisable at \$0.04 per Option and 8,000,000 are exercisable at \$0.05 per Option collectively on or before 22 November 2027, pursuant to the existing advisory and capital raising agreement, 6,500,000 unlisted options are exercisable at \$0.125 per Option and expire on 29 March 2026.

1.7 Effect on Control

Based on current shareholding and Entitlements of Shareholders (including substantial Shareholders) as at the date of this Prospectus, regardless of the amount raised under the Offer, no Shareholder will increase their holding, to an amount in excess of 19.9% through applying for their Entitlements.

Further, there will be no change to any Shareholder's voting power as a result of the issue of the New Options. Where New Options are exercised into Shares, the voting power of the Shareholders who exercise the New Options will increase. The likelihood of New Options being exercised is dependent on the price of Shares from time to time until the New Options expire.

1.8 Potential dilution on non-participating Shareholders

In addition to potential control impacts set out in Section 1.7, Shareholders should note that if they do not participate in the Offer, their holdings will not be diluted as no Shares are being offered under this Prospectus.

No immediate dilution will occur as a result of the issue of New Options under this Prospectus. However subsequent exercise of any or all of the New Options will result in dilution. Assuming all New Options offered pursuant to this Prospectus are issued and exercised into Shares, Shareholders who do not participate in the Offer, are likely to be diluted by an aggregate of approximately 33.33% (as compared to their holdings and number of Shares on issue as at the date of the Prospectus).

The Offer is being made as a pro-rata non-renounceable entitlement issue of up to 219,656,079 New Options, on the basis of one (1) New Option for every two (2) Shares held by those Shareholders registered at the Record Date at an issue price of \$0.003 per New Option, exercisable at \$0.03 each on or before the date that is 18 months from the date of issue, to raise up to approximately \$658,968 (based on the number of Shares on issue as at the date of this Prospectus). Fractional entitlements will be rounded up to the nearest whole number.

Based on the capital structure of the Company as at the date of this Prospectus, approximately 219,656,079 New Options may be issued under the Offer.

As at the date of this Prospectus the Company has 43,000,000 Options on issue all of which may be exercised prior to the Record Date in order to participate in the Offer. Please refer to Section 4.2 for information on the exercise price and expiry date of the New Options proposed to be issued.

All of the Shares issued on exercise of the New Options offered under this Prospectus will rank equally with the Shares on issue at the date of this Prospectus. Please refer to Section 4.1 for further information regarding the rights and liabilities attaching to the Shares.

The purpose of the Offer and the intended use of funds raised are set out in Section 3.

The Offer is non-renounceable. Accordingly, a Shareholder may not sell or transfer all or part of their Entitlement.

2.3 Payment options

(a) Electronic Funds Transfer

For payment by Electronic Funds Transfer (**EFT**), please follow the instructions on the Entitlement and Acceptance Form. You can only make a payment via EFT if you are the holder of an account that supports EFT transactions to an Australian bank account. Please note that should you choose to pay by EFT you must return a completed copy to the Company in accordance with the instructions set out in the Entitlement and Acceptance Form and:

2.4 Implications of an acceptance

- (b) you acknowledge that once the Entitlement and Acceptance Form is returned, the application may not be varied or withdrawn except as required by law.

2.5 Minimum subscription

There is no minimum subscription.

2.6 Shortfall Offer

Any Entitlement not taken up pursuant to the Offer will form the Shortfall Offer (**Shortfall New Options**). The Shortfall Offer is a separate offer made pursuant to this Prospectus and will remain open for up to three months following the Closing Date. The issue price for each Shortfall New Option to be issued under the Shortfall Offer shall be \$0.03 being the price at which New Options have been offered under the Offer.

If you do not wish to take up any part of your Entitlement you are not required to take any action. That part of your Entitlement not taken up will form part of the Shortfall Offer and potentially be allocated to other Eligible Shareholders or other third parties as part of the Shortfall Offer. The Shortfall Offer will only be available where there is a Shortfall between applications received from Eligible Shareholders and the number of Shares proposed to be issued under the Offer.

No Shortfall New Options will be issued to a party under the Shortfall Offer if the effect would be to increase that party's voting power in the Company to an amount greater than 19.99% following exercise of the Shortfall New Options and based on the Company's capital structure as at the date of this Prospectus.

The Company reserves the right to issue an Eligible Shareholder a lesser number of Shortfall New Options than applied for or no Shortfall New Options at all. However, the Directors do not intend to refuse an application for Shortfall New Options from Eligible Shareholders other than in circumstances of oversubscription or where acceptance may result in a breach of the Corporations Act. If the number of Shortfall New Options applied for by Eligible Shareholders exceeds the total Shortfall, the Shortfall New Options will be allocated among applying Eligible Shareholders proportionate to their existing holdings.

New Options issued pursuant to the Shortfall Offer will be issued on a progressive basis. Where the number of New Options issued is less than the number applied for, or where no issue is made surplus Application monies will be refunded without any interest to the Applicant as soon as practicable after the closing date of the Shortfall Offer.

Pending the issue of the New Options or payment of refunds pursuant to this Prospectus, all Application monies will be held by the Company in trust for the Applicants in a separate bank account as required by the Corporations Act. The Company, however,

will be entitled to retain all interest that accrues on the bank account and each Applicant waives the right to claim interest.

4. RIGHTS AND LIABILITIES ATTACHING TO SECURITIES

4.1 Rights and liabilities attaching to Shares

The following is a summary of the more significant rights and liabilities attaching to the Shares issued on conversion of the New Options offered under this Prospectus. This summary is not exhaustive and does not constitute a definitive statement of the rights and liabilities of Shareholders. To obtain such a statement, persons should seek independent legal advice.

Full details of the rights and liabilities attaching to Shares are set out in the Constitution, a copy of which is available for inspection at the Company's registered office during normal business hours.

(a) General meetings

Shareholders are entitled to be present in person, or by proxy, attorney or representative to attend and vote at general meetings of the Company.

Shareholders may requisition meetings in accordance with section 249D of the Corporations Act and the Constitution of the Company.

(b) Voting rights

Subject to any rights or restrictions for the time being attached to any class or classes of shares, at general meetings of shareholders or classes of shareholders:

- (i) each Shareholder entitled to vote may vote in person or by proxy, attorney or representative;
- (ii) on a show of hands, every person present who is a Shareholder or a proxy, attorney or representative of a Shareholder has one vote; and
- (iii) on a poll, every person present who is a Shareholder or a proxy, attorney or representative of a Shareholder shall, in respect of each fully paid Share held by him, or in respect of which he is appointed a proxy, attorney or representative, have one vote for each Share held, but in respect of partly paid shares shall have such number of votes as bears the same proportion to the total of such Shares registered in the Shareholder's name as the amount paid (not credited) bears to the total amounts paid and payable (excluding amounts credited).

(c) Dividend rights

Subject to the rights of any preference Shareholders and to the rights of the holders of any shares created or raised under any special arrangement as to dividend, the Directors may from time to time declare a dividend to be paid to the Shareholders entitled to the dividend which shall be payable on all Shares according to the proportion that the amount paid (not credited) is of the total amounts paid and payable (excluding amounts credited) in respect of such Shares.

The Directors may from time to time pay to the Shareholders any interim dividends as they may determine. No dividend shall carry interest as against the Company. The Directors may set aside out of the profits of the Company any amounts that they may determine as reserves, to be applied at the discretion of the Directors, for any purpose for which the profits of the Company may be properly applied.

Subject to the ASX Listing Rules and the Corporations Act, the Company may, by resolution of the Directors, implement a dividend reinvestment plan on such terms and conditions as the Directors think fit and which provides for any dividend which the Directors may declare from time to time payable on Shares which are participating Shares in the dividend reinvestment plan, less any amount which the Company shall either pursuant to the Constitution or any law be entitled or obliged to retain, be applied by the Company to the payment of the subscription price of Shares.

(d) **Winding-up**

If the Company is wound up, the liquidator may, with the authority of a special resolution, divide among the Shareholders in kind the whole or any part of the property of the Company, and may for that purpose set such value as he considers fair upon any property to be so divided, and may determine how the division is to be carried out as between the Shareholders or different classes of Shareholders.

The liquidator may, with the authority of a special resolution, vest the whole or any part of any such property in trustees upon such trusts for the benefit of the contributories as the liquidator thinks fit, but so that no Shareholder is compelled to accept any shares or other securities in respect of which there is any liability.

Subject to restrictions on the issue or grant of securities contained in the ASX Listing Rules, the Constitution and the Corporations Act (and without affecting any special right previously conferred on the holder of an existing share or class of shares), the Directors may issue Shares as they shall, in their absolute discretion, determine.

(h) **Variation of rights**

Under section 246B of the Corporations Act, the Company may, with the sanction of a special resolution passed at a meeting of Shareholders vary or abrogate the rights attaching to Shares.

If at any time the share capital is divided into different classes of shares, the rights attached to any class (unless otherwise provided by the terms of issue of the shares of that class), whether or not the Company is being wound up, may be varied or abrogated with the consent in writing of the holders of three quarters of the issued shares of that class, or if authorised by a special resolution passed at a separate meeting of the holders of the shares of that class.

(i) **Alteration of constitution**

In accordance with the Corporations Act, the Constitution can only be amended by a special resolution passed by at least three quarters of Shareholders present and voting at the general meeting. In addition, at least 28 days written notice specifying the intention to propose the resolution as a special resolution must be given.

4.2 Terms of New Options

A Notice of Exercise is only effective on and from the later of the date of receipt of the Notice of Exercise and the date of receipt of the payment of the Exercise Price for each New Option being exercised in cleared funds (**Exercise Date**).

(g) **Timing of issue of Shares on exercise**

Within 5 Business Days after the Exercise Date, the Company will:

- (i) issue the number of Shares required under these terms and conditions in respect of the number of New Options specified in the Notice of Exercise and for which cleared funds have been received by the Company;
- (ii) if required, give ASX a notice that complies with section 708A(5)(e) of the Corporations Act, or, if the Company is unable to issue such a notice, lodge with ASIC a prospectus prepared in accordance with the Corporations Act and do all such things necessary to satisfy section 708A(11) of the Corporations Act to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors; and
- (iii) if admitted to the official list of ASX at the time, apply for official quotation on ASX of Shares issued pursuant to the exercise of the New Options.

If a notice delivered under (g)(ii) for any reason is not effective to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors, the Company must, no later than 20 Business Days after becoming aware of such notice being ineffective, lodge with ASIC a prospectus prepared in accordance with the Corporations Act and do all such things necessary to satisfy section 708A(11) of the Corporations Act to ensure that an offer for sale of the Shares does not require disclosure to investors.

(h) **Shares issued on exercise**

Shares issued on exercise of the New Options rank equally with the then issued shares of the Company.

(i) **Reconstruction of capital**

5.1 Introduction

The future performance of the Company and the value of its Shares may be influenced by a range of factors, many of which are largely beyond the control of the Company and the Directors. The key risks associated with the Company's business, the industry in which it operates and general risks applicable to all investments in listed securities and financial markets generally are described below.

The risks factors set out in this Section 5, or other risk factors not specifically referred to, may have a materially adverse impact on the performance of the Company and the value of its Shares. This Section 5 is not intended to provide an exhaustive list of the risk factors to which the Company is exposed.

Before determining whether to invest in the Company you should ensure that you have a sufficient understanding of the risks described in this Section 5 and all of the other information set out in this Prospectus and consider whether an investment in the Company is suitable for you, taking into account your objectives, financial situation and needs.

If you do not understand any matters contained in this Prospectus or have any queries about whether to invest in the Company, you should consult your accountant, financial adviser, stockbroker, lawyer or other professional adviser.

5.2 Company specific

Sovereign and Political Risk	The Company's Projects and Operations are located in the Republic of Madagascar and Indian. Mineral exploration tenure in the Republic of Madagascar is governed by Madagascan legislation. Our Joint Venture operations are in India and also aspects of our operations are subject to the laws, rules and regulations that are unique to operating an expandable graphite development plant. The laws and regulations in India are extensive and whilst the Company currently complies with all requirements to conduct its activities, environmental and other legislative change may occur without notice which may impact our operations. As such, the Company is exposed to the risks associated with operating in foreign countries. These risks may include economic, social or political instability or change, hyperinflation, currency non-convertibility or instability, and changes of law affecting foreign ownership, exchange control, exploration and mining permit licensing, export duties, investment into a foreign country and repatriation of income or return of capital, environmental protection, land access and environmental regulation, mine safety and labour relations, as well as government control over mineral properties or government regulations which require the employment of local staff or contractors or that other benefits be provided to local residents. The Company may also be hindered or prevented from enforcing its rights with respect to government instrumentalities because of the doctrine of sovereign immunity. Any future material adverse changes in government policies or legislation in the Republic of Madagascar that affect

The Company cannot guarantee that the tenements in which it may acquire an interest if it completes the acquisition pursuant to the Madagascar Acquisition Agreement, or any other tenements in which it has or may acquire an interest in the future, will be renewed beyond their current expiry date and there is a material risk that, in the event the holder of those tenements is unable to renew any of them beyond their current expiry date, all or part of the Company's interests in the corresponding projects may be relinquished. Further, there is no guarantee that any applications for mining or environmental tenements or other approvals or authorisations will be granted, or granted on conditions satisfactory to the Company. The Company's future operations in the Republic of Madagascar may be affected by changing political conditions and changes to laws and mining policies. The effects of these factors cannot be accurately predicted and developments may impede the operation or development of a project or even render it uneconomic. The Company's joint venture operations in India may also be affected by changing political conditions and changes to laws and mining policies. The effects of these factors cannot be accurately predicted and developments may impede the operation or development of a project or even render it uneconomic. Further details about our joint venture risk are outlined below.

Under those amodiation contracts, the third parties have been granted exclusive rights to prospect, explore, extract and/ or exploit certain mineral resources. The tenements affected by amodiation contracts are PE/5394, PE/25093, PE/25094, PR/25605 and PR/25606. Mada-Aust does not have the rights to prospect, explore, extract and exploit certain mineral resources on those tenements to the extent that exclusive rights have been granted under an amodiation contract. Mada-Aust is in the process of negotiating to discharge certain of the amodiation contracts or to remove certain tenements from the amodiation contracts. Under Madagascan law, the holder of a mining tenement does not have an automatic right in the land the subject of that tenement and must therefore enter into a lease agreement with the owners of the land. If land is held in the name of the Madagascan state, there is no objection by the state to entry into a lease agreement on ordinary terms and conditions. If, however, the land the subject of any of the tenements it owns in Madagascar is not held in the name of the Madagascan state, Mada-Aust will need to negotiate a lease with the private landholders.
New Projects and Acquisitions	The Company will identify and evaluate additional projects and assets in the resources sector in Australia and/or overseas. If any are considered by the Board to have the potential to add Shareholder value, the Company will seek to acquire them by way of direct project acquisition, farm in, joint venture or direct equity in the project owners. There can be no guarantee that any proposed acquisition will be secured, completed or successful. If the proposed acquisition is not completed, monies advanced or due diligence costs may not be recoverable, which may have a material adverse effect on the Company.
