8.8.1 Does the entity expect that it will continue to have the current level of net operating cash flows for the time being and, if not, why not?

Answer: Yes, The Company expects improvement in the cash inflows from the sale of gold from its Santa Barbara mine in the near term. In addition to just over \$1m in funding from the sale of the non-core Atocha Silver Project and the near-term production on the Brazilian Phosphate project. Lastly, the Board believes, based on the Company's record of raising capital it will be successful in raising capital as and when required.

8.8.2 Has the entity taken any steps, or does it propose to take any steps, to raise further cash to fund its operations and, if so, what are those steps and how likely does it believe that they will be successful?

Answer: Yes, The Board believes that based on the Company's record of raising capital it will be successful in raising capital as and when required. This is based on the Board's expected improvements in operations and processing of the mineralised exploration material at the Santa Barbara Mine, in addition to the near-term production of the Brazilian Phosphate project. Lastly, the successful completion of the sale of the of the non-core Atocha Silver Project.

8.8.3 Does the entity expect to be able to continue its operations and to meet its business objectives and, if so, on what basis?

Answer: Yes. As noted in Item 8.8(2), the Directors will continue to seek further capital as and when required through debt and equity raises. Based on the Company's record of raising capital, the Board believes that it is in a position to raise capital as and when required to fund the Company's operations and to meet its business objectives.
