On 2 July 2025, the Company entered into an unsecured short term loan with Argonaut Partners Pty Ltd of \$750,000 as part of sale agreement relating to the Company's 17.5% interest in the Greater Duchess JV. The Loan had an establishment fee of \$30,000 and interest payable of 1% per month commencing from 1 October 2025. The loan was repaid on the completion of the JV interest sale in accordance with the terms of the loan. The \$750,000 loan was repaid on the completion date of the JV interest sale on 16 October 2025 including payment of interest up to that date of \$3,750. (refer 8.8.2 below).

Answer:

The Company has secured additional funding post the September quarter that is sufficient to fund future activities.

On 2 July 2025, the Company announced the sale of non-core interest in the Greater Duchess JV with cash consideration of \$2m and unrestricted fully paid shares in Carnaby Resources Ltd to the value of \$4m on completion.

The transaction completed on 16 October 2025, with the Company receiving \$2m in cash and the shares in Carnaby Resourced Ltd. Funds from the sale were used to repay the loan of \$750,000 as disclosed in 7.6 above.

Remaining cash provides near term, non-dilutive funding which will enable the Company to continue advancing its Finnish and Western Australian assets. Furthermore, the \$4m of shares received are unrestricted and sale of the shares will provide additional funds as and when required.

8.8.3 Does the entity expect to be able to continue its operations and to meet its business objectives and, if so, on what basis?

Answer:

Yes, the Company does expect to be able to continue its operations and meet its business objectives based on level of planned exploration activities. Future exploration activities will be targeted and cost effective to be funded from working capital ensuring commitments are being met.
